Transylvania Saxon Trivia: In 1876, the Saxon Nationsuniversität, a 700-year-old system of Saxon self-administration, was abolished by the nationalist Hungarian state to increase pressure to Magyarize. The Saxon Lutheran church replaced the abolished "Nationsuniversität" as a refuge for their Saxon identity and the "Saxon bishop" was recognized as a spiritual and secular authority. Church leaders like Bishop Georg Daniel Teutsch (1817-1893) and his son Bishop Friedrich Teutsch (1852-1933) created roles within the church where the "Magyarization" could be resisted. The Evangelical Lutheran church became "The Church of the Germans in Transylvania". Here sermons were still held in German and German could remain the teaching language in schools.

### Schloss Horneck needs OUR help!

Since 1960 Schloss Horneck has housed the Siebenbürger Museum, Siebenbürger the Library and Archive, the Siebenbürger-Institut and is the base for many Saxon organizations. A seniors home is also located on the property. Last September the Verband der Siebenbürger Sachsen in Deutschland purchased the property for one million Euro.



Donations were received from individuals and organizations to help fund the purchase of the property. The purchase of Schloss Horneck gives the Siebenbürger Saxons throughout the world a central location where Saxon artifacts, books and other historical documents can be collected and stored to preserve our ethnic history for many years.



### Bought your chicken feed yet?

Chicken feed produced a golden egg for one Illinois candy company.

Back in 1900, Gustav Goelitz's Confectionery Company produced and sold candy corn as chicken feed. Goelitz marketed the candy in a box branded with a rooster and the tagline: "Something to Crow About."

It caught on.

According to the Goelitz website, the candy was such a success, it "carried the company through two World Wars and the Depression," and saved it from bankruptcy.

More than 100 years later, the fourth Goelitz generation is still selling the identical candy and recipe, although the com-



pany changed its name to Jelly Belly Candy after its primary candy product. In honor of its roots, it developed a candy corn-flavored jelly bean.

Candy corn is still a favorite Halloween treat, only it has slipped one notch to second place, with anything chocolate taking the number one honors.

Manufacturers produced 9 billion pieces of candy corn in 2015; that's 35 million pounds. One serving amounts to 140 calories (3 mini-Hershey bars); a single piece is around 3.57 calories.

In case you are wondering, there is a preferred way to eat the corn. According to a survey by the National Confectioners Association, 43 percent start with the narrow white end. About 10 percent begin eating the wider yellow end first.

Companies are tinkering with the candy corn recipe and trying new flavors, like caramel apple, caramel popcorn, and cinnamon. The Zachary Confections company (sells to retail stores like Target) makes 12 varieties, including blackberry cobbler, raspberry lemonade, cherry and pumpkin spice.

Candy corn has made its way into Oreos, M&Ms, coffee, bagels, and even a martini.







# Beneficiary

noun

ben·e·fi·cia·ry \ be-nə-'fi-shē- er-ē, -e-rē, -'fi-sh(ə-)rē\

Merriam-Webster defines BENEFICIARY as:

- 1. One that benefits from something
- 2. The person:
  - Designated to receive the income of a trust estate
  - Named (as in an insurance policy) to receive proceeds or benefits.

As a member of the Alliance of Transylvanian Saxons, you have either a life insurance policy or an annuity contract, or perhaps both. While completing the application process, you named a person or entity as the beneficiary of the contract. This beneficiary is the person who would receive the life insurance proceeds, or any remaining funds of an annuity, when you die.

Most insurance and annuity applications ask for both a primary beneficiary and a contingent beneficiary. The contingent beneficiary would receive the funds if the primary beneficiary would pass away before you did. Some common examples of named beneficiaries include a spouse as primary and children as contingent, or in the case of a minor child, the parents as primary and a relative or sibling as contingent. If you don't have any living relatives, you could name a friend or a charity as a beneficiary. Your choice of beneficiary can vary widely depending on your family and/or financial situation.

Often, these original beneficiaries are still on the policy long after life-changing events have occurred. Are you now married, but your parents are still the beneficiary? Are both of your parents still alive? Are you now widowed, but your spouse was the beneficiary? Or possibly worse, is your ex-spouse still named as your beneficiary? You should review your beneficiaries on your ATS policies every few years to make sure the beneficiaries read how you want them to. In addition, you should review any other types of policies you may have such as 401(k)s, IRAs, Group Life insurance at work, etc., to be sure those beneficiaries are up to date.

Should you list your estate or trust as a beneficiary? While there may be some instances where this is fine, most times you shouldn't. When your life insurance policy or annuity has a person as the beneficiary, the proceeds are paid directly to that person or persons, and avoid the probate process. If you name your estate as the beneficiary, then the proceeds will go to the estate, help pay expenses, and then will be distributed as your will dictates. This process may take a long time before the funds are distributed and may cause an increase in estate taxes and the funds could also be subject to creditor claims. If your policy names a trust as beneficiary, then those proceeds are retained by the trust. Most times the trust is irrevocable, and you forfeit control over the trust, including the right to change the beneficiary of the trust. You should consult your financial advisor or attorney before naming an estate or trust as your beneficiary.
