



Transylvanian Saxon Trivia: The Evangelical church in Reichesdorf was originally the residence of a monastic order. During the Protestant Reformation, the monks were banished by the Saxon villagers and the church became the property of the community. Reichesdorf became a prosperous village located about four miles south of Birthälm. But before Reichesdorf was founded.

the area was rough and swampy. Only wild animals lived among the reed, the willow trees and thistles. As a memory of those times, the coat of arms of the village was created showing a heron stepping through a lake guided by a star under a red sky. In the church a mythical bird finds a reputed place on the crown of the chancel. It is a fact the water birds often appear on European coats of arms and that the pelican became a symbol of the Passion of Jesus and of the Eucharist since the 12th century.

History of Thanksgiving

The tradition of Thanksgiving started with the Pilgrims who settled at Plymouth, Massachusetts. They first held a celebration of their harvest in 1621. The feast was organized by Governor William Bradford who also invited the local Wampanoag Indians to join in the meal. The first time they called the feast "Thanksgiving" was in 1623, after rain had ended a long drought.

The first national Thanksgiving Day was proclaimed by President George Washington in 1789. However, it did not become a regular holiday in the United States until 1863 when Abraham Lincoln declared that the last Thursday in November should be celebrated as Thanksgiving. Since then it has been celebrated every year in the United States. The day was made an official federal holiday and moved to the fourth Thursday of November in 1941 by President Franklin Roosevelt. In Canada, they celebrate Thanksgiving on the second Monday in October.

Thanksgiving Day is a day set aside each year where people in the United States and Canada give thanks to God for all the blessings they received during the year by feasting and prayer. It is a special time for families to get together to enjoy each other's company,

Congratulations Staff Sergeant Michael Ferguson!







SCHEDULE for cooking Thanksgiving Dinner

If you want to do it right and avoid undue stress, you're going to need some sort of schedule for Thanksgiving dinner. This is old hat to some, and slightly terrifying to others. No need to panic, however -- no Trello boards necessary (unless you like them), just a bit of thought.

A few weeks ahead of time, choose your recipes, keeping oven temps and cooking times in mind. Consider a fresh turkey, which can help free up fridge space. Buy your non-perishable goods (sugar, flour, frozen cranberries, etc).

Good news: A LOT of items can be made ahead of time. This includes soups, cranberry sauce, and pies, though The Food Network cautions against making apple or pecan pies more than one day ahead of time because the crusts won't stay flaky. Casseroles can be as-



sembled.

The day before, consider what can be cooked before the turkey and after the turkey. You'll have about an hour to work with after the turkey comes out of the oven to rest.

Some day-of suggestions from Food Network:

• First: prepare stuffing and/or dressing as well as vegetables (clean, peel, and chop).

- Just before the turkey's done: start cooking fresh vegetables, and prep anything else that needs to go into the oven, like stuffing, rolls, etc.
- While the turkey is resting under its foil tent: bake stuffing, if needed; warm mashed potatoes -- yes, they can be made a day or two ahead of time! -- rolls, soups, and casseroles; cook frozen vegetables; make gravy; put it all on the table!

Why did Romania enter World War I

By the outbreak of war in Europe in 1914, Romania had long been at odds with Austria-Hungary over the issue of territory—specifically Transylvania, which was ethnically Romanian but then part of Hungary. Seeing Russia's success against Austria on the battlefields of the Eastern Front during the summer of 1916, Romania hoped to make an advantageous entry into the war in order to realize long-held dreams of territorial expansion and national unity. On August 18, 1916, the Romanian government signed a secret treaty with the Allies; by its terms, in the event of an Allied victory Romania would acquire Transylvania, up to the River Theiss, the province of Bukovina to the River Pruth,

and the entire Banat region, all territory under Austro-Hungarian control. On August 27, Romania fulfilled its treaty obligation by declaring war against Austria-Hungary. On August 27, 1916, after Romania declares war on Austria-Hungary, formally entering World War I, Romanian troops cross the border of the Austro-Hungarian Empire into the much-contested province of Transylvania.

As Romanian troops opened a new front of the war in Transylvania, British forces pressured Germany on the Somme River, and Austria faltered against Russia in the east, Kaiser Wilhelm II of Germany briefly panicked, telling close confidantes that "The war is lost." He regained perspective quickly, however, and moved to strengthen Germany's defensive position, replacing Erich von Falkenhayn with Paul von Hindenburg as chief of the German General Staff on August 28. Within two weeks, at a conference that included Turkish and Bulgarian leaders, Wilhelm sanctioned the creation of a Supreme War Command, effectively giving Hindenburg command of all the armies of the Central Powers in World War I.

The demoted Falkenhayn, meanwhile, took control of Germany's operations against Romania; in this he was joined by another prominent German general, August von Mackensen. By December 1916, Falkenhayn and Mackensen had led their troops to a decisive victory against Romania, overrunning much of the country and occupying the capital city, Bucharest, on December 9, 1916. Though Russian troops entered Romania early the following year, the Russian army was on the verge of collapse; with the Russian Revolution that year, the rise to power of the Bolsheviks, and Russia's subsequent exit from the war in early 1918, Romania was forced to surrender to the Central Powers at Bucharest that May, having suffered some 335,000 casualties during the course of the war, not

According to the Peace of Bucharest, Romania lost land along its coast to Bulgaria, as well as control of the mouth of the Danube River, which the Central Powers commandeered. The Treaty of Versailles in 1919 reversed these losses, however; it also gave Romania control of the long-desired province of Transylvania.


