
Retirement of ATS Medical Examiner Dr. David E. Schuller

Dr. David E. Schuller has served as our Medical Examiner for the past forty years and has written to the Board of Directors his desire to retire as our Medical Examiner. He had fully retired from the medical faculty of the Ohio State University as of July 1, 2015 and is no longer involved in clinical medicine. He and his wife, Carol, wish to enjoy full retirement by traveling and residing four months of the year in Florida.

He said he assumed the responsibilities of the ATS Medical Examiner as a means of expressing his loyalty to our fraternal benefit society as well as pride for his Saxon heritage and in honor of his parents, Elsie and Dan Schuller, who were members of Cleveland East – Branch 33.

Throughout his career, Dr. Schuller made outstanding achievements in the medical field. He joined The Ohio State faculty in 1976 and rose to become Chair of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery in 1984, serving in that position for 21 years and leading it to become a nationally ranked department. He was appointed Director of the Comprehensive Cancer Center and CEO of The James in 1988 and served in that capacity for 10 years. He subsequently continued as CEO of The James and Deputy Director of the Comprehensive Cancer Center for an additional 10 years. During his twenty years of leadership, the Cancer Center dramatically increased its external funding, he created and recruited the leadership for the Human Cancer Genetics Program which is now considered one of the best in the United States, raised in excess of \$350 million of philanthropic support, and led The James to becoming nationally ranked in just nine years. Dr. David E. Schuller

Schuller is nationally and internationally known for his work in head and neck oncology. He is the author of over 278 peer-reviewed publications, 47 book chapters/monographs, and editor/author of nine medical textbooks including at one time the most popular book for medical students and the most popular book for practitioners. His early research changed the standard of care for the treatment of life-threatening airway obstruction in children with croup.

For the past 30 years, he has focused on developing novel therapeutic strategies for the treatment of head and neck malignancies. He chaired the National Cancer Institute research leadership group whose research dramatically improved the standard of care of the second most common malignancy in the world. Dr. Schuller has been appointed to numerous national organizations, including the Otolaryngology Residency Review Committee, serving as its Chair for more than two years as well as the American Board of Otolaryngology, serving as President.

He has served in a variety of leadership positions of national cancer research organizations for the past 30 years, most recently as Co-Chair of the National Cancer Institute Head and Neck Steering Committee. In March, 2013, he was honored by being designated as

Transylvanian Saxon Trivia: After the Treaty of Trianon of 1920, Romania rapidly became increasingly nationalistic. It began gradual Romanization campaigns. City and town names in Transylvania were changed from German to Romanian (like Hermannstadt to Sibiu) and bilingual education was compulsory. The Saxons, who were a longtime commercially powerful force in Transylvania, were hit particularly hard. The Saxon Lutheran Church, a focal point of Saxon politics, lost 55% of its lands, and many towns lost over 50% of their private property.

The Ohio State University College of Medicine Distinguished Professor.

Dr. Schuller was the Vice President of Medical Center Expansion. He articulated the original vision for the current medical center expansion in 2002 and had been working full-time since 2009 on the \$1.1 billion project which included a new James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute and Critical Care Center. He led a team that was awarded a \$100 million grant for the radiation oncology center, which is the largest grant in the history of Ohio State. The new cancer hospital will become one of the largest in the United States with an architectural design that integrates research and education with patient care, which is felt to be unique of any vice, the ATS Board of Directors

Schuller was named recipient of a national award by Healthcare Design honoring those professionals responsible for leading the development of exciting, inspirational, and influential contributions to the healthcare arena.

The Alliance of Transylvanian Saxons Board of Directors are so grateful to Dr. Schuller for his valuable service to our organization by assisting us in conducting our insurance business. 
Thanksgiving tradition: The banner card



National Alzheimer's Awareness Month

Researchers deveop test for Alzheimer's

A number of research facilities are looking for predictive tests for Alzheimer's Disease, with promising results.

Early detection of Alzheimer's Disease is an important aspect of helping those with Alzheimer's to have a high quality of life, and medical researchers who are looking for tests that aid in early diagnosis of this neurological disease may have found a blood test that does just that, according to a study published in "Alzheimer's & Dementia: Diagnosis, Assessment & Disease Monitoring" in June.

Researchers at Rowan University School of Osteopathic Medicine are developing a blood test - now in clinical trials- that has had a nearly 100 percent rate of accuracy when it comes to detecting Alzheimer's Disease in patients thus far.

The National Institute on Aging has developed a blood test that detects the onset of Alzheimer's

The Salk Institute is also looking into how a protein called Neuregulin-1 affects individuals with Alzheimer's - they have discovered that this specific protein can lower the number of molecules that create the amyloid beta plaques in Alzheimer's patients' brains. In the mice treated with the protein in the trial, the amount of plaque in the brain was much lower than of the mice in the control group.






