We reviewed our Quarterly Statement that is filed with the State Insurance Departments and NAIC, the Management and Analysis and Discussion report that is filed with the State of Ohio, the investment and other financial reports. Our total assets were increased to \$88.8 million and net income as of September 30, 2017, was \$582,167. The results of our 2017 third quarter are in line with our projections for the year. Schloss Horneck needs OUR help!

Since 1960 Schloss Horneck has housed the Siebenbürger Museum, the Siebenbürger Library and Archive, the Siebenbürger-Institut and is the base for many Saxon organizations. A seniors home is also located on the property. Last September the Verband der Siebenbürger Sachsen in Deutschland purchased the property for one million Euro.



Donations were received from individuals and organizations to help fund the purchase of the property. The purchase of Schloss Horneck gives the Siebenbürger Saxons throughout the world a central location where Saxon artifacts, books and other historical documents can be collected and stored to preserve our ethnic history for many years.

Transylvania Saxon Trivia: Hermann Julius Oberth, born June 25, 1894 in Hermannstadt, is, along with the Russian Konstantin Tsiolkovsky and the American Robert Goddard, one of the three founding fathers of rocketry and modern astronautics. Interestingly, although these three pioneers arrived at many of the same conclusions about the possibility of a rocket escaping the earth's gravitational pull, they seem to have done so without any knowledge of each other's work. Oberth's interest in rocketry was sparked at the age of 11 when his mother gave him a copy of Jules Verne's From The Earth To The Moon. At the age of 14, he designed the concept of a recoil rocket, which would use expelled exhaust gas to propel itself. In 1931 Oberth received a patent for a liquid-propellant rocket from the Romanian Patent Office, and the first rocket was launched on May 7, 1931, near Berlin. Oberth became a mentor to a young assistant by the name of Wernher von Braun. Together they worked in rocketry research for both Germany and the United States. Their work led to development of the Saturn V rocket, which carried men to the moon. Hermann Oberth is memorialized by the Hermann Oberth Space Travel Museum in Feucht, Germany, and by the Hermann Oberth Society. The museum brings together scientists, researchers, engineers, and astronauts to carry on his work in rocketry and space exploration. He even was recognized on the Big Screen. The science-fiction movie Star Trek III: The Search for Spock mentions the Oberth-class of starships hypothetically to be in his honor. Later on, this same class of starships is mentioned in several episodes of the American TV series Star Trek: The Next Generation. He died in Nurnberg, Germany in 1989 at the age of 95.

Holiday weight gain? Not as bad as one would think

People gain weight during the holidays, but not as much as they think, according to dietitian Cynthia Sass.

Sass points to a 2009 study from Texas Tech University that followed 48 men and 100 women for six weeks from Thanksgiving to Christmas. On average, the subjects gained one and a half to two pounds each.

While this gain isn't terrible, it tends to stay on. Sass says weight creep is responsible for adults gaining 10 to 20 pounds over a 10 year period.

If you want to avoid that extra pound or two, Sass recommends drinking two cups of water before meals. One study found that adults who followed this prescription were able to shed 40 percent more weight during a 12-week diet period. Drinking water also makes us less hungry.

Finally, budget your carbs. Holidays are carb heavy with potatoes, cakes, pies, breads, and cookies. Try to choose just one carb item each day so you can indulge, but not at every single meal. If banana bread is on the menu for lunch, skip the toast and potatoes at breakfast and dinner.

The ancient language of **Christmas**

More than any other holiday, Christmas has spawned a language of its own. Words like yule, noel, and wassail are reserved exclusively for the Christmas season.

Yuletide has been synonymous with Christmas since at least 900 AD, according to the Guinness Book of Christmas (Guinness). The word yule was derived from the Norse word, JÃ31, a heathen feast which lasted 12 days. The feast was so important that the Anglo-Saxon name for December (aerra-geola) translates to "before yule" and January (aftera-geola) means "after yule."

Noel originated as an expression of joy for the birth of Christ. It comes from the Latin word "natalis" or birth. Residents of Gaul (France) dropped the "t" sound and it became "na'al" and evolved as "noel."

Wassail is the name of a beverage and was also used as a greeting such as "Wassail, my friend, and drink to a happy noel." Wassail can also be a car-


We hope all of the above have a wonderful and happy day.

Strength training improves quality of life

There is one good reason to stay active as we age: living better.

According to Tufts University's Friedman School of Nutritional Science and Policy, "it's way more dangerous not to be active as older adults." The reason for this warning is that decreasing physical activity over time is likely one of the leading causes of age-related disability and mobility issues.

According to Tufts, strength training increases muscle mass which helps support the body, maintain balance, and promote increased bone mass. These perks directly aid in preventing falls. Research at the University of British Columbia shows that strength training can also boost brainpower. Memory tasks and executive function, along with higher-level abilities like juggling multiple tasks both saw improvement with a mix of cardiovascular and strength training.

Despite the benefits, strength training should be approached with caution by seniors who are not used to that level of physical activity. Silver Sneakers highlights the fact that many older people have pre-existing injuries or muscle tightness and imbalance caused by years of inactivity. Work with a personal trainer and avoid leg presses, crunches, running, bench presses, and shoulder presses -- at least at first.

Walking encourages better posture and continuously works the connective tissues between joints. Squats are another simple exercise that promotes hip mobility. Starting the movement with a backward push in the hips, keep the chest up and be sure that the knees don't travel far past the feet. Pushups can be made easier with knees on the floor, which is a better start for beginners. Rounding out a basic program, try a rowing machine to get the unused back muscles safely in the mix while helping to strengthen spinal support.

They were overdue for a family vacation and Payne's


> own happy memories of Disney World loomed large in her mind. They just couldn't afford to take the kids to the Magic Kingdom, not that year. So she prayed for this
