



## CONVENTION PREPARATION NOMINATIONS FOR ELECTIONS OF ATS OFFICERS

In preparation for the upcoming convention, nominations for newly elected officers have to be nominated by their Local Branch prior to the convention and the nomination forms are to be submitted to the ATS Home Office 60 days prior to the date of the National Convention. Nomination forms have been sent to each Local Branch. Corporate governance for fraternal benefit societies has come under scrutiny by State Insurance Regulators. They closely review the education, qualifications, expertise and experience of each board member. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners have mandated that an annual corporate governance disclosure be made annually. It is important that we elect qualified individuals to serve on the ATS Board of Directors.

The following offices will be up for election at the 2020 Convention: President, Second Vice-President, Secretary and two Trustees. To be eligible for the office of President, a member must be in good standing and have served as an Alliance National Officer for at least five years.

Nominee for election to a national office must meet the following:

- 1) Be a member of the Alliance in good standing for the past three years
- 2) Be an American citizen
- 3) Not be an immediate family member of current officer or nominee. (immediate family member shall be defined as a spouse, parent, child, sibling, grandparent, grandchild, step-parent or stepchild).

4) Possess general knowledge of the fraternal benefit society system and the fraternal workings of the Alliance

5) Have served as a Delegate to at least one previous National Convention.

6) Be willing to complete continuing education as designated by the Board of Directors of the Alliance.

7) Have the willingness and commitment to devote the necessary time to fulfill the duties of office.

8) Not be a current officer in another fraternal benefit society.

9) A candidate must be elected a delegate and attend the Convention.

After being elected the member must complete a Biographical Affidavit required by the Ohio Insurance Department which lists a person's educational background, employment record for past 20 years, types of licenses, any legal (criminal or civil) cases, adjudged a bankruptcy, etc.

**Completed Nomination forms must be received at the ATS Home Office by March 30, 2020. The forms must be signed by the Nominee, the Branch President and Branch Secretary.**

The list of names of nominees and their qualifications will be sent to the Local Branches for their review and printed in the Volksblatt prior to the convention session. The 2020 Convention will be held at the Cleveland East Marriott the weekend of May 30-31. Our convention host is ATS Branch 33.

Orthodox Lent on Shrove Monday, March 2. Our religious faith has always been an integral part of the Saxon community and Lenten season is a time that we reflect and repent in preparation for Easter. Shrove Tuesday or also referred to as Fat Tuesday, is the Christian day of partying and indulgence before the austere season of Lent. Originating in the medieval era, most Christian European traditions had developed a version of fried dough for Shrove Tuesday. The rich treats presented a way to use up all of the butter, sugar and fat in the house prior to the self-denying diets of Lent. Our Saxon Krapfen is our cultural version of the fried dough. When I was child, it was customary for our family to have Krapfen on Shrove Tuesday. Truly a culinary delight!

Transylvanian Saxon Trivia: Hermannstadt, founded in the 12th century by Saxon settlers is rated as one of the best cities in Transylvania. The city was neglected for much

of the 20th century but has seen a renaissance in recent decades, and was chosen European Capital of Culture in 2007. The current President of Romania, Klaus Iohannis, a Transylvanian Saxon, is credited with overseeing the city's revival during his time as mayor. Hermannstadt has just been voted among the best European destinations for 2020 in the European Best Destinations competition. Hermannstadt is presented as one of the most modern and dynamic cities in Europe with something to offer visitors that include culture, gastronomy, history and outdoor activities.

Through the centuries our Saxon craftsmen skills have created a beautiful city that captures our Saxon culture. Over the last nine centuries Hermannstadt was not only the largest and the wealthiest of the seven fortified cities established by the Saxons, but also the most important trading center with 19 guilds and considered the cultural capital of the region. Hermannstadt had established the first hospital (1292), pharmacy (1494), school and library. The main attraction of the city is represented by Old City with its beautiful preserved Squares and especially Huet Square that is dominated by the Evangelical Church which was built between 1320 and 1520 which makes it the oldest church in Hermannstadt. Plan to travel with other ATS members in 2021 when the Federation of Transylvanian Saxons will host another huge Sachsen Heimattreffen that will be held in Hermannstadt the weekend of August 6 -8<sup>th</sup>.

### How to find lost AirPods

If you already have the Apple Find My iPhone set up (and you should), the Find My AirPods feature is already set up. 

**Persian or Oriental Rugs:**

**The difference and history**

The first known mention of Persian carpets comes from around 400 BC when Greek author Xenophon writes that the carpets were so precious that they were an acceptable gift for diplomacy. Luxury, prestige, a sign of wealth.

And so they have remained 2,000 years later. Authentic Rugs from Persia (modern Iran) are still expensive, despite many modern competitors creating similar items. After all, the rug secrets of knotting, colors, and materials have long since been revealed.

The hallmarks of a true Persian rug: Natural dyes; hand-knotted with the Persian Knot; made of wool and/or silk fibers; ending with structural fringe, not sewn or glued, according to Rug Knots.

Today, most major museums have a Persian carpet dating from at least the 16th century. These extraordinary carpets can be worth millions, according to the New York Times. In fact, in 2013, Sotheby's sold a 17th century, 9-by-6.5 foot car-



pet made in Southeast Iran for \$33 million, the highest known price.

Trade sanctions have made it illegal for US dealers to sell Persian carpets made after 1987, when the sanctions began. Today if someone advertises such rug, it has been illegally brought into the U.S. or the seller is telling a fib.

But not to worry. If you can't afford millions, there are plenty of options available.

Essentially any authentic Persian-style carpet made outside Iran is called an Oriental Rug. So long as it matches the hallmarks of the Persian style, it can be considered genuine. But the

price has many fewer zeroes. An authentic Oriental area rug can run about \$4,000 to \$6,000. Small rugs are much more affordable, in the \$500 range, and are often used as wall hangings.

Some Oriental rugs are manufactured in the Persian style using Bamboo silk, considered a little more eco-friendly since it doesn't kill silk worms.

**4 tips to maintaining  
your rugs**

Items as precious as Oriental and Persian rugs require some special considerations. Here are just four, according to Rug Knots.

1. Avoid traffic damage by moving the furniture around periodically. This will encourage different step patterns.

2. Avoid locations with direct sunlight, which will encourage fading over time.

3. Don't brush tangled fringes. In fact the fringes will fall back into place, if you flip the rug over.

4. Vacuum once a week. Do not use aromas or powdered rug fragrances. Vacuum with the grain.

## MAKE SNOWMEN FOAM CUPS

### YOU WILL NEED:

- Foam cups
- Felt
- Medium pom poms
- Pipe cleaners
- White craft glue
- Scissors
- Black marker

Cut a 1-inch wide strip of felt using the full length of the felt sheet. Fringe the ends with scissors by cutting 4 or 5 slits at each end.

Cut triangles from orange felt (or paper) and glue to the face area.

For the earmuffs, cut a pipe cleaner in half. Bend it around the top of the snowman and trim the ends so that they hang over by about 1/2 -inch.

Trim one side of a pom pom to make it a little flatter.

Glue to the pipe cleaner on the side of the snowman's head. Repeat for the other side.
