PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Tax season is nearing its end and so I want to remind our members that there still is time to contribute to your ATS Traditional or ROTH IRA for 2016 or if you do not have an ATS IRA and had earned income then it is time to start one. Eligible taxpayers under the age of 50 can contribute up to \$5,500 and for those who are 50 or older the limit is increased to \$6,500. For Roth IRAs contribution limits phase out as income rises above the threshold for making contributions. Given the tax-advantages and the opportunity to build capital over the long term, an ATS Roth and Traditional IRAs can be used as part of a comprehensive financial plan to help you achieve and maintain your savings goals for retirement. You have until April 18th to make your contributions for 2016.

The TSBA ended its season with the TSBA Tournament that was held in Salem. We want to thank TSBA officers and local branch cities for hosting the bowling sessions and, of course, the bowlers who traveled to each city to enjoy camaraderie with their fellow ATS members. The TSBA Convention will be held at the Youngstown Saxon Club on Saturday, June 10, 2017 to set up next year's schedule. I encourage you to join next year and share in the fun. You don't have to be a skilled bowler (I certainly am not) to enjoy making friends with ATS members from other cities.

We just received information from our Canadian Saxons who will be hosting the 2017 North American Saxon Heimattag in Kitchener, Ontario the weekend of June 23 – 25 at the Alpine Club. The celebration will include performances from various USA and Canada culture groups, dinner and dancing and a church service on Sunday. A reservation form is printed in this issue of the *Volksblatt* along with a list of hotels. All ATS culture groups are invited to perform during the weekend. To encourage attendance, if any branch or cultural group rents a bus for their trip to the Heimattag, the ATS Board of Directors has approved to pay 50% of the cost of rental. It would be lovely to see representation from each ATS branch city.

Even though frost may still rime our windows in the morning, Spring has officially arrived and in a week, we will be celebrating Easter. Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday following the first full moon on or after the vernal equinox. Some years Western Christian churches and Eastern Orthodox churches celebrate Easter on different Sundays because the Western Christian churches use the Gregorian calendar and the Orthodox churches use the older Julian calendar. Eastern Orthodox Easter always falls after Passover since the Crucifixion and Resurrection took place after Jesus entered Jerusalem to celebrate Passover. This year they will celebrate Easter on the same Sunday, April 16.

Holy week is very important to our Transylvanian Saxons as it is to all Christians. Holy week starts on Palm Sunday with the commemoration of Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. It continues on Maundy Thursday with a retelling of the story of the Last Supper, and Jesus' betrayal by a disciple. On Good Friday, we attend church to remember Jesus' death on the cross. And on Easter we proclaim the Resurrection, and celebrate the assurance that not even death could separate us from God's grace. For the past twelve years, the Transylva

Since 1960 Schloss Horneck has housed the Siebenbürger Museum, the Siebenbürger Library and Archive, the Siebenbürger-Institut and is the base for many Saxon organizations. A seniors home is also located on the property. Last September the Verband der Siebenbürger Sachsen in Deutschland purchased the property for one million Euro.



Donations were received from individuals and organizations to help fund the purchase of the property. The purchase of Schloss Horneck gives the Siebenbürger Saxons throughout the world a central location where Saxon artifacts, books and other historical documents can be collected and stored to preserve our ethnic history for many years.

Transylvanian Saxon Trivia: Coloring Easter Eggs was done by cooking the eggs enveloped into a dented leaf in water dyed by onion skins. The covered part of the egg remains white and shows the pattern of the leaf. I remember a Branch 4 member, Susanna Kramer, used to dye her eggs this way for our Easter Egg Hunts at the Sachsenheim. Another Saxon tradition was on Easter Monday the men/boys would go house to house in the village reciting a poem and sprinkling the ladies with perfume.

Distracted phone users drive up insurance prices


Car insurance rates are going up and you can blame the smartphone.

Kids started this U.S. Easter tradition

In the 1800s, the rolling lawns of the U.S. Capitol were an irresistible target for kids on Easter Monday.

One of the few days off for kids and adults, Easter Monday also included lots of left-over hard-boiled eggs.

Naturally, the Capitol soon became the site of egg rolls, in which children would compete to see whose egg could roll farther without breaking. It became quite the thing. In fact, around 1876, 10,000 kids showed up to egg roll. According to history.com, the spectacle was so noisy that no business could be done in the House and Senate chambers. By the end of the day, the lawns were in ruin. Outraged Congressmen immediately wrote legislation protecting the Capitol turf. President Ulysses S. Grant signed the bill two weeks later.

A showdown was avoided the next year when rain discouraged the annual invasion of egg rollers.

Police discouraged the children the following year but, to the rescue, came Presi-

dent Rutherford B. Hayes who, on April 22, 1878, welcomed players to the White House backyard, the first official White House Easter Egg Roll.

In those more innocent years, families picnicked on the lawns while the kids rolled eggs, leaving behind dead grass, trash, broken egg shells, and many hidden and -- increasingly smelly -- eggs.

Cut to 1937 when the annual crowd grew to 50,000 people, inadequately accommodated on the South Lawn. Only WWII stopped the event and the increasingly enthusiastic crowds. When the Roll resumed after post-war rationing ended, it began to assume its modern, and much more controlled, form with an egg roll for little kids and various activities.

Today, the White House holds a lottery to distribute 35,000 tickets for the Egg Roll. If you win one, get ready for hours of lines and a fairly short experience on the White House lawn, but a very memorable family photo.

Pressure cookers are all the buzz in busy families

You may be hearing a lot of buzz about pressure cookers and how they are revolutionizing meal prep and cooking for busy families. Frozen meat to completed meal in as little as 30 minutes? Yes, and you don't have to watch the stove.

The pressure cooker works by sealing in the steam, which increases the pressure and therefore the boiling point of the liquid in the cooker. This allows the food to cook at higher temperatures for shorter amounts of time.

In the old days, stories abounded about pressure cookers that exploded leaving the meal all over the ceiling and walls. But these are not your grandmother's pressure cookers. New models are en-

gineered for safety, with redundant steam release mechanisms.

There are several brands of these digital pressure cookers on the market. You can find models by Farberware, Cuisinart, Instant Pot, and Cook's Essentials. All of these models have safety locking lids and a regulator to control and release pressure and offer options for low or high pressure settings.

Look for pressure cookers with smart cooking settings that let you cook certain meals right the first time. You'll find cookers with buttons for beans, oatmeal, stews, grains and soups.

Most pressure cookers will double as a slow cooker, replacing some of your coun-

tertop appliances. Some cookers have settings for saute, rice, and even yogurt.

The pressure cooker is best used for dishes that would normally take long braising or simmering times. Stews, beans, soups, meat with sauces, and one pot meals work best. A roast is still best left to being cooked in the oven.

There is a bit of a learning curve to master the best cooking times, pressure settings, and temperature. It is best to aim for the low end of the cooking time, as you can always turn the pressure on and add some cooking time if needed. Starting with frozen meat or ingredients will obviously take a little longer. Recipes with not enough water or liquid might result in a burnt dinner.




