PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

On Saturday, April 1, 2017 the ATS Board of Directors held a quarterly meeting. We reviewed the Annual Financial Statement that is filed with the State Insurance Departments and the NAIC, the Management and Analysis Discussion Report that is also filed with the NAIC and the State of Ohio as well as other Investment and financial reports. At year end 2016, our total assets had increased by \$1,765,553 to \$87,313,180 and net income for the year was \$698,538. Our financial reports show growth and strength, however, our membership is decreasing due to the age of membership. That is where we need your help in recommending new members.

We have an organization that we can be proud to promote. To become a member one needs to purchase either a life insurance or annuity contract. Who doesn't need life insurance to protect their family members, to help pay funeral expenses, outstanding debts, or potential estate taxes? And it is necessary for all of us to ensure we will have continued income in our retirement years. The Congress hopes that through education awareness they can make "known" the "unknown" about Eastern European cultures. The Transylvanian Saxons were one of the sponsors for the evening celebration which brought attention to our fraternal society's cultural representation in Ohio.

There were only 96,000 Transylvanian Saxons living in Romania when Nicolae Ceausescu was overthrown. With the borders open, within a short period time there were only 25,000 Saxons remaining in Transylvania. These Saxons were spread out over 266 towns and cities.

Opioid pain relief found to be minimal

In a new study, just 13 percent of people who took an opioid experienced relief of low back pain.

The study was reported at the American Anesthesiologists Annual Meeting.

The study involved 2,030 people with low back pain. Half took opioid drugs but only 13 percent actually had pain relief.

Meanwhile 75 percent of the opioid takers experienced all the side effects: Constipation, sleepiness, cognitive issues, and dependence.

100 years ago... **US** enters The Great War

As the years of the 20th century opened, signs of war were everywhere and by 1914 Europe was fully involved in a war that would eventually kill 9 million soldiers and 7 million civilians.

The United States stayed neutral until 1917. But, in the Atlantic, German submarines attacked any shipping vessel, even neutral ones. The subs sunk five American merchant ships by March 1917.

At the same time, Germany tried to ally with Mexico in a war against the U.S.

On April 2, 1917, President Woodrow Wilson called for war and Congress approved his resolution on April 6.

America's entry into the war was a turning point for the allies of France, United Kingdom, and Russia.

When an armistice was signed Nov. 11, 1918, 4.7 million Americans had served in the brutal war of the trenches. American casualties were 116,516 and wounded were 204,000.


