Many factors in the 20th century had an impact on the membership of the church: The First World War, the inclusion of Transylvania as part of the country of Romania, the post-war depression, WW II, deportations, emigration, communist government, further emigration.

Since 1960 Schloss Horneck has housed the Siebenbürger Museum, the Siebenbürger Library and Archive, the Siebenbürger-Institut and is the base for many Saxon organizations. A seniors home is also located on the property. Last September the Verband der Siebenbürger Sachsen in Deutschland purchased the property for one million Euro.



Donations were received from individuals and organizations to help fund the purchase of the property. The purchase of Schloss Horneck gives the Siebenbürger Saxons throughout the world a central location where Saxon artifacts, books and other historical documents can be collected and stored to preserve our ethnic history for many years.

Yet, the congregation today remains to be a life-giving force for their families and community. Besides weekly worship, the congregation has a variety of other humanitarian endeavors which include a shelter for at-risk children, a workshop for handicapped person, "Meals on Wheels" program and other stewardship work. The current bishop of the Evangelical Church in Romania is Rev. Reinhart Guib. The church contributes spiritual and cultural life with weekly organ concerts in the summer and Bach Choir concerts during the year.

At the Sachsentreffen this coming August, Dr. Robert G. Schneider, a member of ATS Branch 33 and accomplished organist, will have the honor to perform an organ concert at the Stadtpfarrkirche. Dr. Schneider has performed around the world as a conductor and organist with performances in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, St. Mark's Basilica in Venice, Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, the Duomo in Florence, St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna, Cambridge University, England, the Esztergom Basilica in Hungary and the Shanghai Conservatory of Music in China. Robert is the son of ATS Past President Edward R. Schneider.

Memorial Day, May 29, 2017 A day of remembrance evolves with nation's grief

Every grieving generation remembers the casualties of war in its own way.

So, Memorial Day, the day when we remember the men and women who died in war, has evolved. The beginning of the holiday is usually set in 1868, when the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of Union veterans founded in Decatur, Illinois, established a Memorial Day to decorate the graves of the Union war dead.

Throughout the Civil War, families and groups remembered fallen soldiers on many dates and in many places. North and South generally had different traditions for remembrance. Gradually, the traditions came together and by 1968, Congress designated the date as the last Monday in May.

The Civil War posed new problems for the



young republic of America. More than 600,000 soldiers (some say 750,000) died in the conflict, representing 2 percent of the population. (By comparison, U.S. losses in World War II were just over 400,000.) Once national cemeteries were established, the tradition of decorating the graves of fallen soldiers began in earnest.

Today, veteran's groups, individuals and churches decorate graves with flags on Memorial Day, continuing the tradition of honoring the fallen.

Graves and clothing are also frequently decorated with poppies, a symbol of sacrifice that became popular after World War I. It is said that for every drop of blood shed in war a poppy grows in remembrance.

Sound stimulation can enhance sleep, memory

A finely tuned recording of a waterfall might be one key to better sleep and memory, according to a new Northwestern Medicine study.

The study used gentle sounds like a waterfall synchronized to the rhythm of brain waves to test its affect on deep sleep and memory.

Focusing on older adults, the study sought to find a connection between deep sleep, which decreases with age, and memory.

The study used a technique that monitored brain wave movement and played sounds as brain waves rose. It found that the sounds encouraged more deep sleep slow brain waves.

The sound stimulation enhanced both sleep and memory, the study found.

The research might lead to home devices that could use sound to enhance deep sleep and memory.

We are offering four camp programs for the different ages. The programs are designed to allow campers to continue to grow, every time they move to a new age group the type and level of activities increase to meet the needs of that age group:

New Adventurers – Ages 7–8 Songs, creek stomping, hiking, swimming, crafts, discovery time, camp fires and more. Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$165 and \$300 for non-member children.

Discoverers – Ages 9–11 Traditional camp activities plus climbing tower and archery. Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$185 and \$320 for non-member children

Journeyers – Ages 12-14 Includes traditional camp activities plus canoeing, high rope courses and zip line. Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$240 and \$375 for non-member children

Ultimate Challenge – Ages 15–17 Includes camping out at Ohiopyle, Pa, go whitewater rafting and caving at Laurel Caverns.

Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$315 and \$450 for non-member children

The one week camp will be held at Camp Frederick, a beautiful camp located in Rogers, Ohio on 144 acres of forest, rambling streams, rolling hills, glacial rocks and meadows. Camp Frederick is an organized camp center located at the Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia border. The camp is located 1 ½ miles east of Rogers, Ohio off SR 154. The address is 6996 Millrock Road. The camp is staffed with trained and experienced counselors.

At Camp Frederick our campers will be housed in Cabins which accommodate eight persons.

One evening will be devoted to Saxon folk dancing and folklore.

What to eat before a workout

The closer to your workout, the less you should eat, according to Jennifer Sacheck, associate professor at the Friedman School.

Good rules to follow:


- 30 minutes before exercise, choose a 50 to 100 calorie carbohydrate snack such as a cup of fresh fruit, a snack box of raisins or a cup of applesauce.
- 1 hour before exercise, add another 100 calories with 6 ounces of low-fat plain yogurt or a light string cheese snack.
- 2 or more hours, add another 100 calories. You could choose a half cup or crunchy cold cereal, a small banana or a 2-3 ounce pull-top can of tuna.




