Transylvanian Saxon Trivia: The primary reason for Géza II to invite the German settlers to the Hungarian Kingdom was for border defense against Asian invaders, but they were also sought for their mining expertise and ability to develop the region's economy. The Saxons' first settlement phase in Transylvania began in the mid-12th century with colonists that have believed to come from Luxembourg and the Moselle River region that settled in the Hermannstadt area known as Altland. A second phase of German settlement came during the early 13th century consisting of settlers primarily from the Rhineland and Moselle region with others from Thuringia, Bavaria and even from France. They

settled in Bistritz (Nösen). The surrounding area became known as the Nösnerland. Soon the Saxons became regionally renowned as hardworking miners, skillful merchants and thorough craftsmen. Additional settlements were established in Mühlbach which the region was traditionally called Unterwald and Mediasch which the region was known as Weinland. The Hungarian monarch, Andrew II, invited the Teutonic Knights to settle and defend the Burzenland which was in the southeastern corner of Transylvania. The urban area of Kronstadt was constructed. The colonization in this region consisted mostly of the settlers from the Altland. The Kingdom of Hungary's medieval northeastern borders were defended by the Nösnerland Saxons, in the east by the Hungarian border guards, the Szeklers, in the southeast by the Teutonic Knights and Burzenland Saxons and in the south by the Altland Saxons.

For grads: Best places to start career

Congratulations to this year's grads who have left academia just when the economy is booming, employers are hiring, and unemployment is historically

The question is where to start the new career.

A new study by WalletHub ranks 180 cities based on 27 metrics, including number of entry-level jobs, average salary, housing affordability, and friendliness to singles and families.

At the top of the list with the overall best rank was Salt Lake City, Utah, with number 1 quality of life rank and a number 3 professional opportunities rank.

Coming in second overall was Orlando, FL, ranking number 1 in professional opportunities and number 6 in quality of life.

Rounding out the top 10, are Atlanta, GA, Charleston, SC, Tempe, AZ, Austin, TX, Columbia, SC, Denver, CO, Raleigh, NC, and Grand Rapids, MI.

Affordable housing considerations took California locations down on the list, with all but one of the least affordable cities located in California (Oakland, Los Angeles, Glendale and San Francisco.) The lone non-California location ranked as least affordable was New York City.

Meanwhile, Iowa ranked most affordable twice (Cedar Rapids and Des Moines), with other cities including Overland Park, KS, Sioux Falls, SD, and Garland, TX.
