Rules on support animals tightening

Airlines like United and Delta are tightening their rules on emotionalsupport animals kept in the cabin due to a rising number of complications that are impacting their passengers' safety, according to USA Today. United carried around 76,000 such animals last year, and a few high-profile incidents such as their refusal to allow a peacock onboard a flight and a support dog biting another passenger in the face have forced them to act before things get more out of hand, according to a spokesman.

Starting in March, all passengers were required to notify the airline about the animals 48 hours in advance and provide a note from a medical professional substantiating their need for the animal. The animals also need to be trained to behave in public to avoid issues like urination or attacking other people. These rules will help protect those truly in need while preventing fraud.

Transylvanian Saxon Trivia: Dr. Paul Philippi, a very well-known and respected Saxon who was a theologian, historian and politician died on July 27, 2018 at the age of 95. Dr. Philippi was born in Kronstadt on November 21, 1923. He was a prisoner of war after World War II and after his release he studied theology in Germany with the intention of returning to Transylvania as a Pastor. However, he remained in Germany and was a professor at the University of Heidelberg. He returned to Hermannstadt in the 1980's serving as a professor until his retirement. During the revolution in December, 1989, Dr. Philippi co-founded the Democratic Forum of Germans in Romania which is a centrist political party representing the German minority in Romania which in fact presently has a majority of seats in Hermannstadt City Council; and in 2016 elections won 8 out of 33 seats in the County Council where it is the third strongest political faction. He held the chairmanship from 1992-1998 and was presently the Honorary Chairman. During his life, Dr. Philippi was honored for his theological work, for his outstanding commitment in stressing the significance of preserving the history of the Transylvanian Saxons and the importance of the contributions that the German minorities have made and continue to influence the character and history of Romania. He will be remembered for his immense knowledge, diplomacy and courage. We extend our condolences to Dr. Philippi's family.

ATS OPEN-BOWLING TOURNAMENT RULES

- All bowlers must be Alliance of Transylvanian Saxon members in good standing to participate in this tournament. Bowlers must own an ATS Life Certificate with all payments current or paid in full or own an ATS Annuity.
- 2. Each bowler will receive 100% of the difference between his or her average and a two hundred ten (210) scratch with no limit on pins.
- 3. Averages to be used are:
 - A. The bowler's average from the previous five (5) years of tournament accumulative scores.
 - B. If the bowler has no tournament average than the bowler will establish his or her average after the first three games rolled in the tournament, which will then remain the bowler's average for the remainder of the tournament.
- 4. A bowler may bowl only once in each event in this tournament.
- 5. The tournament management will have the right to return for correction any entry, which does not comply with the above rules.
- 6. Prizes will be awarded at the ratio of at least one (1) prize for

- each ten entries. One hundred percent of the prize fee must be returned. Prizes will be awarded by handicapped scores and not by gender. Separate mean and women prizes will be awarded in Singles Event only.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the tournament manager to keep a running record
 - of all bowlers' averages participating in each event.



Baumstriezel und Hanklich werden als siebenbürgische Spezialitäten bezeichnet und angenommen, aber, es ist nicht alles siebenbürgisch drin, wo siebenbürgisch drauf steht. So ist der Baumstriezel

die Krone der altehr-

würdigen Spezialitäten – wienerischen Ursprungs, über Ungarn nach Siebenbürgen gekommen. Im Kochbuch meiner Mutter heißt er auch Prügelkrapfen – es hat mit "prügeln" oder "Prügel beziehen" nichts zu tun, sondern ist in diesem Fall ein dickes Aststück gemeint, auch "der Baum", auf den die süßen Hefeteigstreifen spiralig gelegt werden, um dann auf einem Drehspieß über Holzkohlenglut, mit Butter und Zucker bestrichen/bestreut eine prächtige Karamell-Glasur zu bekommen. Dazu brauchte es früher für den "echten" Baumstriezel mehrere Helfer: Einer musste die Teigstreifen um den "Baum" wickeln, der Drehspieß musste von Hand bewegt werden und eine dritte Person musste oben am "Baum" den Baumstriezel während des Backens mit Butter (zerlassen) und Zucker "behandeln", so dass mehrere Schichten übereinander kamen, bis der Teig darunter fertig gebacken war. Anders ist es mit der Hanklich: Flache, rundliche Teigstücke bilden die Grundlage (Brotteig oder Hefeteig). Weit verbreitet hatten alle Länder ihre eigenen Bezeichnungen und Rezepte für diese schnelle Art der Herstellung flachen Brotes. Dem Siegeszug der Pizza-Fladen kann

sicher nichts gleichkom-

Das Produkt heißt: Schiacciata (Skiatschiatta gelesen) mit Trauben: Dazu benötigt man: ½ kg Brotteig, 2 Esslöffel "Olio extra vergine", 1 Zweiglein Rosmarin und 2 Esslöffel flüssigen Honig (die Etrusker kannten Zucker nicht). Das Öl, zusammen mit dem Rosmarin, werden erhitzt (kurz, aber nicht kochend heiß), wenn es ausgekühlt ist, wird das aromatisierte Olivenöl (ohne das Rosmarinzweiglein) in den Brotteig eingearbeitet - man kann auch einige gehackte Nüsse beifügen. Dann die Teigkugeln flach drücken, mit dem flüssigen Honig bestreichen und mit ganz kleinen süßen Trauben bestreuen. Es können auch Rosmarinnadeln dazu kommen.

Was den Namen der siebenbürgischen Hanklich und "alle ihre Geheimnisse" angeht, ist der "Siebenbürgisch-Sächsischen Volkskunde" von Adolf Schullerus, 1925 entnommen. Die Basis ist: Brotteig (Reste beim Brotbacken) oder Hefeteig (salzig oder süß) mit vielfaltigen Möglichkeiten des Belages.

"Als breitgedrückter Brotteig, mit Speck, Zwiebel, Apfelstückchen, Pflaumen, Pflaumenmus usw. belegt und gebacken, führt dieses Gebäck auch den Namen ,Hangklich', (Briet, ,Schliecht', ,Wiertich' = ,Werktag'), im besonderen ,Baflisch', ,Zwibel' ,Appel' usw.). Der vielbesprochene Name der Hanklich ist wohl am einfachsten als ,einer Hand gleich', also als ,wie eine Hand breitgedrucktes Brot' zu erklären (im mhd. Handliche, die Lautform wäre wie "Mangkel", "Mantel' u.a. zu verstehen). Vgl. in den Kronstädter Quellen 1541, noch gut mhd. ,pro pane et czypo handlich". "Hangklich" würde demnach der Bedeutung nach sich mit 'Bedemchen' und "Fladen" (mhd. Vlade. "flacher Kuchen", urverwandt mit gr. ,breit"), decken."



Ancient spice combines with chocolate for a sweet treat



More than 4,000 years ago, tumeric was being used to spice up food and make medicines in India.

Today, the spice is still an important crop in India, which produces nearly all of the global supply. About 80 percent of tumeric is used in-country to flavor and color food, enhance cosmetics, and make holistic medicines. It is widely used in South Asian, Middle Eastern, and South African cuisines and is notable for its use in curries and rice.

Recent research on two chemical compounds found in the plant have shown some promise for future treatment of Alzheimer's disease, according to the Alzheimer's Society. One chemical, curcumin, has shown some effect on amyloid-beta plaques found in the brains of Alzheimer patients. The other chemical, turmerone, has been shown to stimulate stem cells into making new brain cells, potentially aiding neurogenerative diseases.

Chocolate Tumeric Truffles

Ingredients:

1 cup unsweetened, shredded coconut1/2 cup raw honey, softened1 tablespoon coconut oil, melted 1 teaspoon ground turmeric 1/4 cup dark chocolate chips 1/4 teaspoon sea salt

Mix all dry ingredients together and ensure the coconut is evenly spiced. Next, pour in the coconut oil and honey and stir until completely mixed. Roll the mixture into several small balls (whatever size you'd like) and then place them on a parchment paper-lined baking sheet in the freezer for 10 minutes. Melt the dark chocolate in a saucepan and then drizzle it over the balls once they are finished setting-up in the freezer. Allow to defrost before enjoying.
