Hope to see a lot of you at the September meeting. Take care everyone!



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

On Saturday, August 20, the ATS Board of Directors held its quarterly meeting. We welcomed our newly-elected ATS Secretary, Monica Gilles, who is our newest member on the Board of Directors. We also congratulated Monica Weber to her newly elected office of



2nd Vice President. After 41 years serving as an officer, it seemed a bit strange leading the meeting as President. We welcomed Past President Thomas Manning to our meeting as our honorary member. We reviewed our Quarterly Statement that is filed with the State Insurance Departments and NAIC, the Management Analysis and Discussion report that is filed with State of Ohio as well as the investment and other financial reports. Our assets have increased to \$86.8 million and net gain as of June 30, 2016 was \$619,454. Ratio of surplus to admitted assets has increased to 10.7%. Unfortunately, we have lost 70 members from the first of the year. We ask our membership to help our organization grow by recommending new members for our fraternal benefit society. We share in the best of two worlds, the world of financial products in life insurance and annuities and the world of fraternalism. Transylvanian Saxon History Trivia: The Transylvanian Diet in German, Siebenbürgische Landtag, was the constitutional and political body of the Principality of Transylvania. It consisted of three privileged nations, the Hungarians, the Székelys and the Transylvanian Saxons and recognized the religions of Roman Catholic, Lutheran, Reformed and later Unitarian. In 1542, sessions in Vásárhely (Neumarkt) and Torda (Thorenberg) laid the basis for the political and administrative organization of Transylvania. It decided on judicial, military and economic matters. It ceased to exist following the Austro-Hungarian Compromise of 1867.

Since 1960 Schloss Horneck has housed the Siebenbürger Museum, the Siebenbürger Library and Archive, the Siebenbürger-Institut and is the base for many Saxon organizations. A seniors home is also located on the property. Last September the Verband der Siebenbürger Sachsen in Deutschland purchased the property for one million Euro.



Donations were received from individuals and organizations to help fund the purchase of the property. The purchase of Schloss Horneck gives the Siebenbürger Saxons throughout the world a central location where Saxon artifacts, books and other historical documents can be collected and stored to preserve our ethnic history for many years.

ATS OPEN-BOWLING TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. All bowlers must be Alliance of Transylvanian Saxon members in good standing to participate in this tournament.
- 2. Each bowler will receive 100% of the difference between his or her average and a two hundred ten (210) scratch with no limit on pins.
- 3. Averages to be used are:
 - a) The average of the past five years' tournaments.
 - b) If the bowler has no tournament average then the bowler will establish his or her average after the first three games rolled in the tournament, which will remain the bowler's average for the remainder of the tournament.
- 4. A bowler may bowl only once in each event in this tournament.
- 5. The tournament management has the right to return for correction any entry, which does not comply with the above rules.
- 6. Prizes will be awarded at the ratio of at least one (1) prize for each ten entries. One hundred percent of the prize fee must be returned. Prizes will be awarded by handicapped scores and not by gender.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the tournament manager to keep a running record of all bowlers' averages participating in each event.
- 8. Tournament starts on October 22 and ends on October 23, 2016.
- 9. Closing date for entries is October 12, 2016.
- 10. There will be no refunds of fees after October 19, 2016.
- 11. All Event Winners will be determined by actual scores bowled.
- 12. We will start with Doubles Event followed by the Singles Event on Saturday.

All Events will be a handicap event this year. Your all events final score will be your total individual score of singles, doubles, and team event plus your handicap total for the tournament.



Looking at the Leaves

To avoid crowds, plan your drive for midweek if possible. You should also spend some time talking with the locals. You'll often get tips on secluded areas not widely known. Take your time and schedule in a few longer stops, to give yourself time to eat, take pictures, and enjoy nature at its finest. You should respect private property by not trespassing on non-public land. If you stop for a hike, be sure to stay on established trails and be aware of any wildlife.

A sudden drop in temperature or adverse weather conditions such as rain or snow can affect the amount of leaves on the trees, but you can often find different viewing conditions even just a short distance away. Driving a little further or taking a different direction can often yield great results.


