It was a little different this time without the children being deputized and hauling the adults off to jail for stealing the grapes. Instead, the children split into two groups and each child had to help stuff a scarecrow while blindfolded. It took teamwork for both groups to accomplish their task. Both groups did a fantastic job! With the ongoing pandemic, it felt really good to get out and see people you haven't seen for a while and even get a few hugs. I believe everyone who attended had a wonderful time!

Daylight Savings Time will be coming up in a week or so on Sunday, November 7th. Sometimes I think I'm ready for it, while other times I'm not. However, once the time change occurs, it will be dark earlier in the evening, so I won't like that either. Then there's the whole idea of cancelling Daylight Savings Time. Did you know that Halloween traces its origins to the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain? Samhain is the celebration of the end of harvest season and marked the end of the Celtic calendar year. The holiday is believed to have originated around 4000 B.C. in Ireland. Back then, the Gaels believed that on October 31, the boundaries between the worlds of the living and the dead got a little blurry and the dead would come back to life to wreak havoc among the living. The wearing of costumes and masks were designed as a way to scare aware the dead. If people were dressed as ghouls and other spooks, they thought they would escape the notice of the spirits wandering the streets. Carving pumpkins with a scary face is another way of scaring away those evil spirits. Trick-or-treating evolved from the ancient Celtic tradition of putting out treats and food to placate those spirits who roamed the streets at Samhain. The colors of black and orange trace to Halloween, also. Orange is a symbol of strength and endurance and, along with brown and gold, stands for the harvest and autumn. Black is typically a symbol of death and darkness and acts as another reminder of the festival that marked the boundaries between life and death. Scarecrows, a popular fixture during Halloween, symbolize the ancient agricultural roots of the holiday. Happy Halloween everyone!



Time to plant spring-flowering bulbs



Late October and early November are the best times to plant spring-flowering bulbs. Here's how to do it.

First, select a site that has good soil and good drainage so bulbs will continue to flower year after year.

For tulip, daffodil and hyacinth bulbs, prepare the soil 8 inches deep or more. Plant them six inches deep, measured from the bottom of the bulb, and six inches apart.

For small bulbs such as crocus, glory-of-the-snow and grape hyacinth, prepare the soil six inches deep. Plant bulbs three inches deep and three inches apart.

Lastly, broadcast a tablespoon per square foot of 12-12-12 or 13-13-13 analysis fertilizer and water well. When the ground freezes, mulch with two inches of fine mulch or straw. Home Office: 5323 Pearl Rd., Cleveland, Ohio 44129





Klosdorf / Cloaşterf



After the old church was destroyed, a new construction was erected between 1521 and 1524 and finds itself in a well-preserved state today, as well as the polygonal ring wall strengthened by towers in each corner. The southern tower was replaced in 1819 with today's bell tower. The aisle-less church with polygonal chancel was provided with defence level and machicolation between the buttresses from this construction phase.

The parapets of the 18th century three-side gallery inside the church are decorated with floral motives and paintings illustrating different fortified churches. The organ above the altar was installed in 1832 on the substructure of the original 1716 altar. One of the oldest inscriptions from Transylvania can be found behind this altar: 1524 is the year when the construction works of the church were completed.

Place and surroundings

The small settlement Cloaşterf in eastern Transylvania gave birth to many legends. Near the village are the ruins of a castle known locally as "Monkey Castle". One says that a valuable treasure was once hidden behind an invisible iron door on the castle hill. From time to time this door appears out of nowhere. But it can only be opened with Mandrake, a magic plant.

In fact, once the remains of an urn and a golden coin with

a Greek inscription of Alexander the Great were found here. The real treasure however remains undiscovered to this day.

According to another local myth the girl who finds the first vine with two small leaves on its tip will be lead to the man of her dreams by this branch. The girl should break the branch and put in on her hat. The first young man she meets on the way home from the vineyard she may kiss, as he will be her future spouse.

Knitting: Meditative, calming, interesting -- and it doesn't have to be painful!

With knitting, you can do something productive and challenging, even while sitting in the living room.

Or you can put your mind into a meditative zone, easing your anxiety as you knit along and shed your worries.

Sadly, some give up knitting as they age. Arthritis becomes a problem and it may feel as though repetitive motions create pain.

But there are some options if you want to continue knitting.

Moderation that prevents stress injuries is one key to happy knitting. There might once have been a time when a knitter could knit for hours, but if pain becomes an issue, build in rest periods. Take a 10 minute break



every 45 minutes. Stretch your hands, stand up, drink water

Try using a pillow under each elbow and one on your lap. The pillow on the lap can support a heavy project, like a blanket.

For arthritis pain, warmth usually helps decrease pain and increase mobility. Try soaking your hands in warm

water before beginning. One knitter with rheumatoid arthritis said she warms up her hands in the morning by holding a cup of warm coffee. She then knits for 20 or 30 minutes at night, which seems to help her hands stay nimble. If she doesn't knit, her hands are much stiffer and more painful the next day.

You can also try a circular needle. It can help prevent dropped needles and force you to knit with a flatter posture.

Knitting belt

The European tradition of the knitting belt can also be very useful for knitting continental style. One double-pointed needle holding the project sticks into the belt, while the other hand is free to move. You never bear the weight of the project. A pouch holds a small ball of yarn.

Knitting Aid

Another helpful invention is the Knitting Aid, a device that holds the needles for you, so your grip becomes less important, while it supports the wrists and arms. At \$120, it isn't for everyone, but it might help reduce pain -- or even make it possible to start this heritage art form.




