PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Cleveland Saxon Dance Group held its Trachtenball on Saturday, May 7th. What a delightful evening! Both the adult and the children's dance group performed. We even had some visitors from north of the border as a small group from Aylmer, Canada attended. It was great to see them. They joined in the Aufmarsch and a couple of dances with Cleveland group.

On Wednesday, May 11th, the Federation of Transylvanian Saxons held its annual meeting, via Zoom. The leaders from Germany, Austria, Transylvania, Canada and myself discussed the updated Cultural Exchange schedule as well as other topics. The U.S. will again attempt to host the North American Heimattag in 2023. At that time, the Cultural Exchange group from Traun, Austria will tour the United States and Canada. During 2024, Canada will host the Jugendlager and the rescheduled Sachsentreffen will be held in Hermannstadt. In 2025, the United States will send a cultural group to Europe.

Memorial Day is Monday, May 30. This day is for honoring and mourning the men and women who have died in the performance of their military duties while serving in the United States Armed Forces. To all of those who have lost loved ones in the service, our prayers are with you. To all who have served our country, past and present, THANK YOU!

Did you know the Statue of Liberty wears a size 879 shoe? The Statue is 151 feet and one inch tall. The base, or pedestal, that she stands on is 154 feet tall, which puts the tip of the torch that she holds at 305 feet off the ground. If she needed new shoes, they would be size 879. The real name of the statue is Liberty Enlightening the World, but is often called Lady Liberty. In 1865, Frenchman Edouard de Laboulaye proposed the idea of presenting a monumental gift from the people of France to the people of the United States. He wished to commemorate the centennial of the Declaration of Independence as well as celebrate the close relationship between France and America. Sculptor Frederic-August Bartholdi heard Laboulaye's proclamation and began designing the colossal structure. Engineer Alexandre Gustave Eiffel was engaged to address structural issues. Construction of the Statue was completed in France in July 1884. The Statue was reduced to 350 individual pieces and packed in 214 crates for the voyage across the Atlantic Ocean. The Statue arrived in New York Harbor in June 1885. The pedestal was completed in April 1886. **President Grover Cleveland oversaw the dedication of** the Statue of Liberty on October 28, 1886. The occasion was celebrated with fireworks and the very first ticker tape parade in New York. There are many examples of symbolism in the design. The crown represents light with its spikes evoking sunrays extending

out to the world. There are seven points on the crown, representing the seven continents and the seven seas. The date, July 4, 1776, is engraved on her tablet, noting American independence. Near Lady Liberty's feet are a broken chain and shackle, representing freedom from tyranny and servitude. Her right foot is in mid-stride, which means she is moving forward and leading the way towards freedom. The torch was more than just a symbol. Until 1901, the US Lighthouse Board operated the Statue of Liberty, as the torch represented a navigational aid for sailors (a lighthouse). Lady Liberty is and remains a symbol of freedom, inspiration, and hope, as well as one of the world's most recognizable landmarks.

How far would you drive to save money on gas?

The Association for Convenience and Fuel Retailing (representing mini marts) asked drivers how far they would drive to save 5 cents on gas.

They found that 63 percent of us would drive five minutes out of our way to save 5 cents per gallon. Thirty-six percent of drivers would drive 10 minutes out of their

way to save 5 cents a gallon.

According to the Seattle Times, it's a false economy. To break even on a 20 minute round-trip in a car that gets 30 miles per gallon, you'd have to buy at least 22 gallons of gas to make the 5 cent discount worthwhile. Plus, you spent 20 minutes of your time.

Transylvanian Saxons will finally take place again in Dinkelsbühl in 2022. A whole series of events will also be shown live on You-Tube and Facebook over the Pentecost weekend from June 3rd to 6th.

On Saturday, June 4th, from 11:00 a.m., the Schranneballroom will host the opening of the Heimattag, the young talent event "Our youngsters present themselves" (2:00 p.m.) and the traditional event "Se kit, se kit..." (4:00 p.m.) live streamed.

On Sunday, from 10.30 a.m. the costume parade and the festival rally in front of the Schranne, from 2 p.m. the folk dance event of the SJD "Aus Tradition und Liebe zum Tanz" and from 7 p.m. the open-air concert "Singing in front of the Schranne" will run over the channels.


