PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Attention all Branches and Cultural Groups: Please make sure that your Secretary has sent in the 2023 Branch Roster to the ATS Home Office. This form is what we use to print contact information in the back of the Volksblatt for your Branch or Group. You should include someone for each position: Officers, ATS Secretary, Dues Secretary, Youth Rep, meeting time and place, etc. Mailings from the Home Office are sent to different people in your Branch or Group, depending on the nature of the mailing. Thank you to those Branches and Groups who have already submitted theirs.

On Monday, January 16th, I had the pleasure of attending the Branch 10 – Columbus monthly meeting and lunch. I enjoyed meeting some new people and catching up with those I already knew. It was a nice day and an easy drive, as the sun was shining all day. Thank you for your hospitality, and we look forward to seeing many of you at the Heimattag in July.

We have had a few phone calls recently at the ATS Home Office asking if we will be raising our interest rates on our annuities. The short answer is maybe. The long answer is maybe in the next couple of months. With rates starting to rise, we are seeing CD rates at the bank increasing. However, please remember that those bank rates may require a large deposit and you will pay tax on the earnings. There could also be fees involved that you do not have here at the ATS. Even though interest rates are rising, the ATS has not been able to purchase too many bonds out in the market yet at these increased rates and yields. Until we can purchase a few more quality investments at higher rates, we will maintain the current interest rate on what we pay out. The ATS tries to maintain a spread of 1.5% to 2.0% between what we earn on our investments and what we pay out on our annuities. That spread is what the ATS operates on. It covers the office, benefits to our members, subsidizing Saxon Summer Camp, hosting a Heimattag, etc. On a slightly different note, however, our new annuity contracts as of the first of the year, now have a 3.0% guarantee. This is up from the 1.75% guarantee that we had at the end of last year. That means any new annuity contract that is opened cannot go lower than 3.0% if the rates come back down.

Did you know that Super Bowl Sunday is the second-highest food "Holiday" in the United States, following Thanksgiving? Game day goes hand in hand with pizza, wings, and various kinds of chips and

dips. Pizza tops the list for the day. One out of every seven people order carryout on Super Bowl Sunday and the majority of those orders include pizza. Attention Branch 30 Members:

Please read the following two suggested changes to Branch 30's Constitution. These changes will be voted upon during the March 12th, 2023 general meeting. If ratified, the voting change will go into effect this year. If ratified, the change in dues will go into effect for 2024. If you have any questions, please contact Kiki Eberth (330)-509-8443."

Proposed Change to Branch 30 Constitution: Article VI. Election of Officers; Section 8.

Section 8. In order to qualify for voting, a member must be in good standing for at least five (5) months. Members may vote in person the day of elections or via absentee ballot. If voting via absentee ballot, the following rules shall apply:

- Absentee voting shall commence after the October scheduled meeting for the nomination of officers and trustees and to end prior to the November scheduled election of officers and trustees.
- Ballets will only be accepted during regular business
- Ballets must be signed by voter and sealed in a white business envelope.
- The envelope containing the ballot is to be signed by voting member in presence of an officer or trustee with membership card and valid state or federal identification. Envelope is also to be signed by said officer or trustee and placed in a locked and sealed ballot box.
- The ballot box is to be kept in a locked and secure
- A voter transaction log is to be recorded by said officer or trustee.
- The locked and sealed ballot box is to be opened and counted on election day by the nomination committe. The ballot count must correspond to the voter transaction
- ☐ If there is a discrepancy: ballots not on the log will be discarded.
- The ballot count is to be given to President and recording secretary to be added to the ballot count of that day.
- ☐ The ballots are to be saved and put in a sealed container for one year.
- ☐ The ballots are to be destroyed after one year.

*This proposed change, if passed in the March general meeting, shall be implemented for the 2023 elections of officers.

Proposed change to Branch 30 Constitution: Article VIII. Duties and Rights of Membership; Section 1; Second bullet point.

Shall read as follows:

- \square A member in good standing for forty (40) years shall be required to pay \$20.00 in annual dues.
- *This proposed changed, if passed in the March general meeting, shall be implemented for the 2024 dues payment.


In answer to her plea, an angel appeared and bid her to drink a potion. Unfortunately, this potion did noth-

The ATS Scholarship Grants should not be overlooked by parents of high school seniors who meet the qualifications underlined



Kirtsch / Curciu




The church in Curciu has remained almost unchanged since its construction in the beginning of the 14th century. The remarkable value of the three-aisle basilica with polygonal chancel lies in its outstanding stone masonry. In the chancel the well preserved mullioned windows with tracery can be admired as well as the typical Gothic windows in the tower. The sculptures ornamenting the portals, tower, windows, buttresses, as well as the capitals, keystones, sedilia and the door of the sacristy date back to around 1427. At the beginning of the 19th century the side aisles were heightened, thus obtaining a cross section of a hall church. At the same time both the main nave and the side aisles were covered with a flat, stuccoed ceiling. The tower's defence level was demolished and replaced in 1913 by the present, with zinc sheet covered spire. Today the ring wall with the gate tower initially used as entrance, as well as a Gothic chapel integrated in this wall still stands as part of the fortified ensemble.

Place and surroundings

A special treasure among the Transylvanian villages is Curciu. This romantic place is situated in the wine-growing region northeast of Mediaş, between hills and forests. The place owes its lush green vegetation to the location between the two rivers Târnava Mare and Târnava Mică and has been nicknamed "Mesopotamia".

The fortified church of Curciu was built on a hill in the centre of the village. The entrance leads through the gate tower. The chapel inside the fortification has an ossuary, a room in which the bones of the deceased were kept in the past.

The church of Curciu contains many typical for the Mediaş region beautiful architectural sculptures from the 15th Century. The richly decorated western façade shows a bird, a mask and a monster with a human head between the paws.





Make Valentine's Day dinner special with homemade red sauce

Transform basic pasta and red sauce into a thoughtful and hearty dish that your sweetie will love.

This classic Italian-American red sauce uses canned tomatoes (whole canned tomatoes provide better flavor than crushed canned tomatoes) and is ready in under an hour. For a spicier sauce, add red pepper flakes to taste. To transform it into a cream sauce, stir about 1-1/2 cups of heavy cream into the sauce at the end of the cooking process. Serve with high-quality pasta, either store-bought or homemade.

Ingredients:

2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1/2 small white onion, diced

4 cloves crushed garlic (add extra for more garlic flavor)

1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes (more to taste)

2 teaspoons dried oregano

2 teaspoons dried Italian seasoning

1 can tomato paste (6 ounces)

2 (28 ounce) cans whole peeled San Marzanostyle tomatoes

1 large sprig fresh basil or 1 tablespoon dried kosher salt

2 tablespoons unsalted butter

Open tomatoes, but do not drain. If you do not have an immersion blender or prefer not to use one, dump tomatoes and juices into a bowl and use your hands or a potato masher to crush tomatoes, then set aside. If you plan to use an immersion blender, skip this step.

Using a large pot, saute onions in olive oil over



medium-high heat until they soften and become translucent. Add the garlic and continue cooking until the garlic begins to sizzle, then add red pepper flakes and cook for an additional 2 minutes. When garlic turns light brown, add oregano and Italian seasoning and cook for another minute before adding tomato paste. Cook for an additional three minutes or until tomato paste softens and blends with oil. Stir in canned tomatoes and their juices, then bring to a simmer. If tomatoes were not crushed before cooking, use an immersion blender to blend until the sauce is smooth. Add dried or fresh basil and simmer for about 30 minutes to reduce the sauce slightly and allow flavors to blend and deepen. Drop unsalted butter into the sauce and stir until melted and incorporated. Taste the sauce and add salt as needed before serving.

I have saved money for my retirement and I am ready to retire! What do I do now? What are my options?



When you are ready to retire and are thinking about withdrawing money from your ATS annuity account, you have various options available to you. You can "annuitize" your account or you can leave it as it is. When you annuitize your account, that means that you will select a distribution option. You will need to put some thought into this option because once you make your choice, it cannot be changed. The alternative to annuitizing is you leave the account alone, and can withdraw whatever funds you may need sporadically.

One settlement option is a Life Annuity. This option offers a monetary payment for your entire lifetime. No matter how long you live, you will receive payments. A Life Annuity can be either Straight Life (your lifetime) or a Joint and Survivor Life. With the Joint and Survivor Life, a spouse is the most common person, but is not required to be. On the death of one of the payees, the survivor payee will receive either the same dollar amount or a percentage of the payment as long as the survivor is living, depending on how you set it up. Typical percentages for the survivor are 50% or 100%. A second settlement option is payment for a Specified Period or Dollar Amount. With a Specified Period option, a payment is made for whatever specified period you set up (ex: 5, 10, 20 years, etc.). If you pass away before that time frame is up, your beneficiary receives the remaining payments. A Fixed Dollar option will have payments set at a selected dollar amount until your account is depleted (ex: \$250 or \$500 monthly). If you pass away before the account is depleted, your beneficiary receives the remaining payments. A third settlement option combines both of the above features. A Life Annuity with Period Certain option guarantees that you will receive payments for your lifetime. Unlike the Straight Life option above, this option guarantees that the payments will continue to your named beneficiary if you pass away prior to the end of the set time frame (ex: 5, 10, 20 years).

Remember: an annuity is the only investment that can guarantee an income stream that you cannot outlive!

- Most retirement plans have similar options available.
- You should consult your financial planner or tax preparer before annuitizing your account.
