Branch 5 Lorain Saxons met on April 17 for our monthly meeting with a dwindling attendance to take care of business. A pre meeting dinner will hopefully bring more members out to our next meeting on Monday, May 15 at the Lorain American Slovak Club. We will first meet for dinner at 5 p.m. at the Applebee's restaurant, 4320 N. Leavitt Rd. Lorain, Ohio and then head to our meeting at the club to start at 7 p.m. We're asking for members to bring with them to the meeting, a non-perishable food item(s) as we participate in the American Fraternal Alliance's Fraternal Food Drive taking place April thru May. We will donate these items along with a financial gift to the Second Harvest Food Bank of North Central Ohio.

We hope our members read their Volksblatt either by mail delivery or on the atsaxons.com website and explore the many events featured on the Fraternal Calendar, both nationally and locally. Though Branch 5 does not have a hall or cultural groups as some of the other branches, we are always encouraging our members to participate in supporting these events whenever possible. You will most assuredly be welcomed with friendliness and good cheer, (Gemütlichkeit). Looking ahead to our own calendar, the Branch 5 picnic will again be held at the Lakeview Park picnic pavilion on Sunday, August 27, starting at 1 p.m. It's not too early to be planning our Christmas dinner as many places book early for group gatherings. If you have a local (preferably the Lorain area) place in mind for this celebration time, come and share it with us at the next meeting so we can get the ball rolling.

All members should have received a copy of our Branch 5 constitution and bylaws. It

was amended in 2016 to reflect the merging of the women of Branch 11 with the men's branch under the original Branch 5 constitution.

In the opening statement under the original charter members names it reads: At the end of the 19th century, a group of Saxon people migrated to the United States, and many of these settled in Lorain, Ohio. These people organized to preserve their customs and traditions, and to help each other in times of need. A group of these men met in the home of Mr. Paul Drechsler on July 12, 1903 and founded the Saxon Sick Benefit Society.

On this date, the idea to form this ethnic group of peoples will be 120 years old. At this time there has been no discussion on how best to celebrate or mark this special anniversary. So much of our history has been, to my knowledge, undocumented and quite possibly lost through the many generations before us.

As the writer for this column, I'm reaching out to all of our members whether you are young or old in an attempt to recover as much of our history as possible to put together a publication of sorts before we have nothing to share for those who will come after us. I do have some documents handed down by the previous officers and articles from the Lorain Historical Society showing the old clubhouse at the corner of 29th & Apple Ave, and papers and minutes about its sale in 1990. I even have some old constitution booklets and programs celebrating our 50th and 100th year anniversary. I have nothing on the formation of the women's Branch 11 except a dues ledger from June 1987 until the merger in January

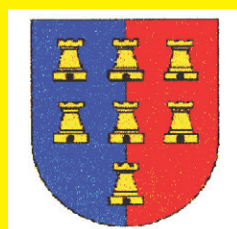
Did you know that the word Pentecost is Greek and literally means 50th day? In Christianity, Pentecost takes place on the 50th day (the seventh Sunday) after the resurrection of Jesus (Easter Sunday). Christians celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ. This event represents fulfillment of the promise that Christ will baptize his followers with the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is one of the Great Feasts in the Eastern Orthodox Church, a Solemnity in the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, a Festival in the Lutheran Churches, and a Principal Feast in the Anglican Communion. The Jewish Festival of Pentecost, called Shavuot, meaning "weeks" in Hebrew, falls on the 50th day after the original Passover. On that day, God gave the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai.

Since its date depends on the date of Easter, Pentecost is a "movable feast". Pentecost is also known as Whit Sunday. The other days of the week are often called Whit Monday, Whit Tuesday, and so on. The native English word Whitsunday or "White Sunday" probably derives from the white robes worn by the

newly baptized on Pentecost. Another explanation is that it derives from the Anglo-Saxon word “wit” meaning “understanding”, as Pentecost was when God poured out the wisdom of the Holy Spirit. The Monday after Pentecost is a legal holiday in many European countries.

It is said that Pentecost marks the birthday of Christianity as a purposeful movement and a new community. When Peter preached immediately afterwards, around 3,000 people believed and were baptized. Pentecost is also said to have broken down the barriers of language. The Old Testament tells the story of people building the Tower of Babel and that God confused their language so they could no longer understand each other. At Pentecost, this Babel confusion was reversed and people could again understand each other.

This year, Pentecost will occur on Sunday, May 28th. And why is that? It’s because Easter Sunday was on April 9th. And why is Easter on a different day each year? Easter Sunday is also a “movable feast” and can occur on any Sunday between March 22 and April 25. The exact date varies because it depends on the moon. Easter Sunday is the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon, meaning the first full moon following the vernal (spring) equinox. The spring equinox is set as March 21 each year. Early Christians wanted Easter to coincide with Passover. And because the Jewish calendar is tied to solar and lunar cycles, the dates of Passover and Easter fluctuate each year.

Two of our members, Sisters Betty Ralph; who is at Anchor Lodge for rehab and Arlene Gilles, who is

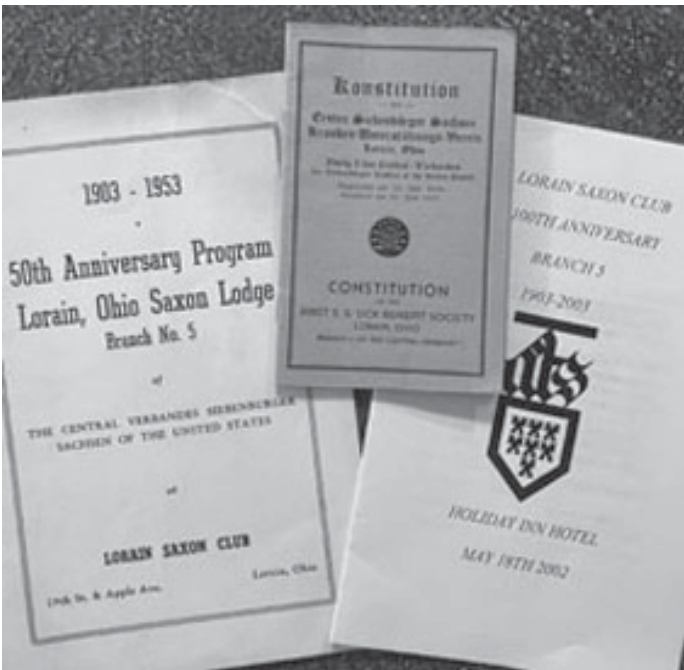
still under a doctor's care, are still on the sick benefit list. We are hopeful for full recovery for both these ladies real soon.

The programs are designed to allow campers to continue to grow, every time they move to a new age group, the type and level of activities increase to meet the needs of that age group.

- New Adventurers – Completed K-2nd Grade** Songs, creek stomping, hiking, swimming, crafts, discovery time, camp fires and more.
Cost: ATS Junior Member \$150 and \$350 for non-member children
- Discoverers – Completed 3rd- 4th Grade** Traditional camp activities plus climbing tower and archery.
Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$170 and \$370 for non-member children

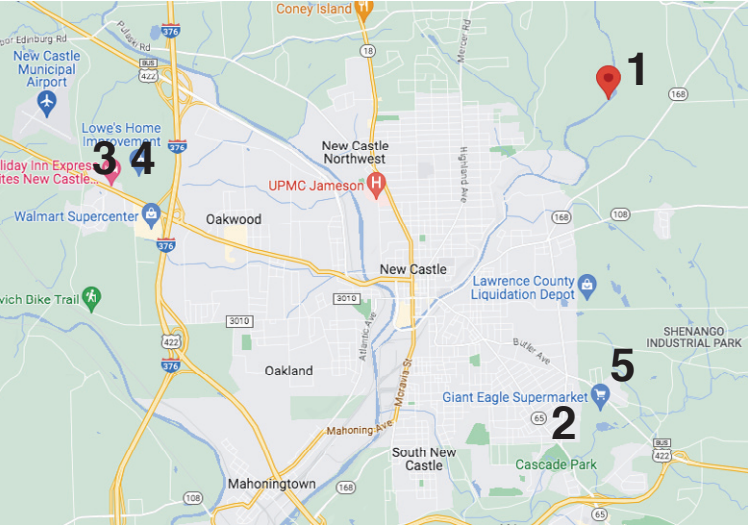



In Ohio, the month of April is designated as "Eastern European Month". The Eastern European Congress of Ohio culturally unites the people of Ohio whose ancestry and heritage are from Eastern Europe. It fosters events and discussions through bipartisanship to advance Ohio's Eastern European awareness, economic development, and education.

Manage expenses with a sinking fund

You can manage your family finances the same way as big companies manage their looming debts -- with a sinking fund.

Instead of trying to come up with a chunk of money when big expenses loom, contribute money to a sinking fund that will be used to pay specific expenses. It's different than long-term savings or an emergency fund.

Your emergency fund should provide living expenses for three to six months if you lose your job or unexpected situations change your income. The key word is unexpected.

A long-term savings account should cover long-term goals: retirement, the



purchase of a home, or even a vacation home.

A sinking fund, meanwhile is for specific expenses that will occur at a specific time, according to Dave Ramsey. Things you know about. You know little Johnny is going to need braces in three years or in two years you will go on a big vacation. Open a specific savings account as a sinking fund, and every month contribute part of the amount you will need in three years. You could stash the money

in your emergency fund or savings account, but using a sinking fund gives you a clear conscience that you can use the money and you have saved for this expense. You'll be able to see exactly what you have saved toward the goal.

The good part of thinking ahead is that you don't use a credit card or personal loan for expenses you know are coming. It will also help you curb your impulse purchases because you'll always know how much you need for expenses.

The most important thing is to be faithful to the fund. Decide how much you have to contribute to reach your goal and do it.


