PRESIDENT'S

On Saturday, May 20th, the ATS Board of Directors met in Salem, Ohio. Topics discussed included the planned ATS activities and events for this summer as well as reviewing our first quarter financial statements. Our net income for the first three months of the year was \$288,391. During the week leading up to the meeting, the Investment Committee met with our Investment Counselor, as we do prior to every Board Meeting. Our advisor evaluates our portfolio and monitors the ratings of our bonds and stocks on a continuous basis. He reassured the Committee that the ATS investment portfolio is well positioned and he does not foresee any issues with our investments. With the recent troubles in the market place, I want to reassure our members that their investment in the ATS is safe and secure.

Following the Board of Directors meeting, the ATS Branch Presidents met. The 2022 year-end financials and investments were discussed. Reports were also given on Cultural and Youth events. Scholarship awards were announced, with the Presidents of the recipients' branch receiving a certificate to forward to the winning students. The ATS Subsidy Grants were presented to the Cultural Groups and the Branch Sharing checks were distributed. Judy Both from New Castle, Br. 27 received her Branch President pin. Sales deputies Michael Teutsch and Monica Gilles received awards for their Insurance and Annuity sales efforts. Congratulations to all.

On Tuesday following those meetings, I had the privilege to go to Germany for the Heimattag celebration in Dinkelsbühl. I will write about my trip and provide some pictures in the next issue of the paper.

Please remember to make reservations for our North American Heimattag to be held in New Castle, PA on July 7th and 8th. All meals at the Heimattag are on a prepaid reservation basis. We are looking forward to the band and dance group from Traun, Austria performing as well as our own cultural groups and dance groups from Canada. on, remember the good times that you had with him. Happy Father's Day! Did you know that the

nation's first Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910, in the state of Washington? However, two years earlier, on July 5, 1908, a West Virginia church sponsored the nation's first event strictly in honor of fathers. A Sunday sermon in memory of 362 men who died the previous December in an explosion at the Fairmont Coal Company mines occurred. This event, however, was a one-time commemoration and was not an annual holiday. following year, a Spokane, WA woman named Sonora Smart Dodd, tried to establish an official equivalent of Mother's Day for male parents. She was one of six children raised by a widower. She drummed up support from local churches, the YMCA, shopkeepers and government officials. The first statewide Father's Day was in 1910. The holiday started to spread slowly across the nation. In 1916, President Wilson honored the day by using telegraph signals to unfurl a flag in Spokane when he pressed a button in Washington, DC. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge urged state governments to observe Father's Day. During the 1920s and 1930s, there was a movement to scrap Mother's Day and Father's Day and create a "Parent's Day". The rationale behind this movement was that both parents should be loved and respected together. This effort was derailed during the Great Depression. During World War II, advertisers began to argue that celebrating Father's Day was a way to honor the American troops and support the war effort. By the end of the war, the day still was not a federal holiday, but it was a national institution. In 1972, Richard Nixon signed a proclamation making Father's Day a federal holiday. This was 58 years







Fathers Day, June 21 Thanks, Dad, we know how important you are

There's more to being a dad than earning a living.

According to researchers, meaningful time with dad is crucial for child development. Researchers now know that interactions with your infant or toddler influence how your kids will relate to other people later in their lives and how they will view the world at large.

A study at the University of Regensburg in Munich, Germany, found that children whose fathers played with them in a sensitive, supportive and challenging way at age two tended to form closer and more trusting relationships with others at ages 10 and 16.

By age 16, fathers' play proved even more powerful and predictive than the mother-child bond. The researchers found that dads' play made a pivotal and unique contribution to kids' growth.

Telling stories of family history and how your parents and grandparents overcame adversity has an influence on how kids handle difficult times. An Emory University study showed that among children aged 14 to 16, the ability to retell parents' stories is linked with a lower rate of depression and anxiety.

Your stories, told with eye contact about how you and others overcame problems, can help your children view the world with optimism.


