PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The weather was beautiful all day and into the evening. We had some new people and our regulars attend, and we were happy to see both sets that day. The Bingo winners won Subway cards and various prizes were awarded during the drawing. For those who have never attended ATS Family Day, you are missing out! Please consider joining us next year.

Summer is almost over. That means it will be TSBA bowling season! The first bowling session will be on September 17th, hosted by the Salem, Ohio bowlers. If you are looking for some fun and a way to meet other Saxons, this is your chance. The Transylvanian Saxon Bowlers Association league bowls one Sunday a month in a different city. Teams are made up of 4 people. If you do not have enough for a full team, please come anyhow. Teams are always looking for a substitute bowler. I wanted to remind everyone that the ATS is currently paying 3.5% on all annuities with a contract date after June 30, 1996. Those of you who have an annuity contract dated prior to that date are still earning 4.5%. I know the economy is tough right now, but if you have some extra cash and want to put it into a safe place to earn a good interest rate, the ATS is the place to put it. If you do not currently have an annuity with the ATS, now is a good time to open one. You can start an annuity with \$300 or as much as you want. The opening amount for children under 16 is \$150. Other than a surrender charge in the first five years if you withdraw too much from the account, the ATS does not charge any fees on the accounts. The minimum amount for additional deposits into the account is \$25. Your annuity could be a tax-qualified account such as a Traditional IRA or a Roth IRA, if wanted. Those of you nearing retirement may want to consider transferring your pension or 401(k) into an ATS account. Contact the ATS Home Office or your local sales deputy if you have any questions.

Did you know that George Washington created the first military honor known as the Purple Heart? On August 7, 1782, General George Washington, the commander in chief of the Continental Army, created the "Badge for Military Merit". The badge was a decoration consisting of a purple, heart-shaped piece of silk, edged with a narrow binding of silver, with the word *Merit* stitched across the face in silver. The badge

was to be presented to soldiers for "any singularly meritorious action" and permitted its wearer to pass guards and sentinels without challenge. honoree's name and regiment were to be inscribed in a "Book of Merit". General Washington's "Purple Heart" was awarded to only three known soldiers during the Revolutionary War. Those soldiers were Elijah Churchill, William Brown, and Daniel Bissell, Jr. The "Book of Merit" was lost and the decoration was largely forgotten until 1927 when General Charles P Summerall, the U.S. Army chief of staff, sent an unsuccessful draft bill to Congress to "revive the Badge of Military Merit". In 1931, Summerall's successor, General Douglas MacArthur, took up the cause, hoping to reinstate the medal in time for the bicentennial of George Washington's birthday.

On February 22, 1932, on George Washington's 200th birthday, the U.S. War Department announced the creation of the "Order of the Purple Heart". The new Purple Heart medal has aspects of Washington's original design, plus a bust of Washington and his coat of arms. This medal is the oldest American military decoration for military merit. It is awarded to members of the U.S. armed forces who have been killed or wounded in action against an enemy, on or after April 5, 1917. It is also awarded to soldiers who have suffered maltreatment as prisoners of war. August 7th is recognized as National Purple Heart Day.

Opioids may not work for back pain

Opioid pain relievers may not alleviate back and neck pain and could cause harm, according to a new study published in the Lancet in June. Researchers at the University of Sydney in Australia treated 310 study participants with either the opioid oxycodone or a placebo. After six weeks, the placebo group had lower average pain scores than the opioid group. At the six and 12-month marks, more people in the opioid group reported ongoing pain. The study's authors concluded that opioids should not be the first choice for acute neck or back pain.

Endless scrolling is a sign of trouble

It seems like innocent fun: Scroll through reels to see people with funny dogs, fabulous houses, weird lifestyles.

But if you do it too much, you become hypnotized or even addicted to the experience. Over time you become isolated, anxious and depressed, says psychiatrist Dr. Sanjay Jain.


Ironically, while you are becoming isolated, the people making the reels are out and about training their funny dogs, working on their fancy houses, and forging their strange opinions. If you continue scrolling instead of doing something, you miss the chance to build your own social and life skills.

According to Jain, more than an hour spent on Instagram or Tik Tok each day suggests an addiction that may leave you stressed and anxious when not scrolling. Worse, you start comparing your life to others and stop interacting with real people.

In fact, if you can't imagine deleting these apps, you have a problem.

Some advice:

- Keep your own life tasks at the top of your mind. Cleaning is boring, but necessary. So get off the chair, turn on some music, and start. You can set up a time to do tasks that can't be used for social media.
- Be inspired. If you love funny animal videos, start engaging with animals yourself. What you regularly watch may give you some ideas about hobbies that would be interesting to try.
- Talk. Get a real-life conversation started with a real human being. Face to face -- not on text or through posting.

Corn: On the cob or off, it's a treat with big health benefits

Corn hasn't had much good press lately. Upstarts like broccoli have been stealing the show, but corn is an ancient food that deserves our respect.

The Aztecs served corn, and the Mayans did too. Native Americans saved the Pilgrims from starvation by demonstrating how to grow corn. Now, modern people find it an excellent source of great flavor, vitamin C, and fiber.

Corn bran can protect the heart. One study at Illinois State University shows that men who ate a low-fat diet



plus 20 grams (less than a teaspoon) of corn bran each day for six weeks had a 13 percent drop in triglycerides, the blood fats that contribute to heart disease. Those who ate wheat bran

showed no such change.

The soluble fiber in corn binds with cholesterol in bile from the liver. It then passes from the body and takes the cholesterol with it.

There's more to corn than


just medical benefits. Corn on the cob is a great seasonal treat. Choose white corn instead of yellow for more fiber. When cutting it off the cob, try to get the whole kernel. Or cut the corn from the cob, then run the back of the knife down the rows to get it all.

Buy mature corn and cook it while it's still fresh. Husk just before cooking. Steaming corn is best, because boiling draws out some of the nutrients.

When adding corn to a salad, use raw corn for a flavorful, crunchy addition to other vegetables.

Spicy Southwestern Cornbread

Cook 1/2-cup diced red bell pepper with 1/2-cup onion and one minced jalapeno in 2 tablespoons butter over medium heat until soft. Prepare an 8-ounce box of cornbread mix, adding 1 cup corn and the pepper mixture to the batter. Pour into a greased 8-inch round cake pan, sprinkle with 1/2-cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese, and bake at 400 degrees for about 25 minutes. Serves 8 to 12.

Remembering Samuel Fleischer: November 16th 1931- June 2nd 2021

We can't believe that Sam has been gone for 2 years already. He was an outstanding Saxon member of branch 37, Detroit.

Sam was always there to pitch in whatever the club needed done, including maintaining the Saxon Acres along with his wife Susanna.

In his fashion of true Saxonism he fashioned three flags for the procession at the Detroit Heimattag in 2000. We remember his input and suggestions for the club's welfare. Sam, the true Saxon, wore his Saxon Tracht at many parades that were sponsored by the GACC and the Sterling Heights memorial parade. Every year he supplied the venison for our hunters banquet in the fall that his wife cooked for us. He also kept many animals at his property in Holly, Michigan, including peacocks, which he harvested feathers from and gave to friends as decoration.

Sam's property is guarded by two guard houses which

Get your groove on with line dancing



Line dancing just looks like so much fun, but it can be baffling on your first try. But there are some secrets to the art and when you understand them, line dancing is much less daunting.

First, a line dance lasts from three to five minutes and you can drop out at any time. Among all the popular line dances, the Electric Slide is the shortest, lasting from two to three minutes and makes a good beginning dance to learn. It is the dance that often opens a line dance party, especially as a warm up. The steps are fairly easy and the dancers face different directions four times.

If you are new to line dancing, here are some tips:

- The dance starts when the singing starts. Everything before that is the in-
- Moves usually change after four counts. When you get to four, you'll change direction or make a new
- You can make any move plain or fancy, low move-

ment or high. Instead of doing actual stomps, for example, do a tap.

• Notice how many times the dancers turn to face a different direction. These are called walls. A line dance can have one wall or up to four. But the dance will usually end up facing the same way it started.

Here are some other popular line dances:

- Cha-cha slide. You get to make a little cha-cha move. There are some hops, but you can substitute tip toes.
- Boot scootin' boogie. More difficult in that it has a series of hops, including one in which dancers cross their legs. It also has a quick half-beat step.
- Cupid shuffle. A modern song with easy steps and kicks, although experienced line dancers usually improvise their steps. Stick with the basics at the beginning.
- Cotton-Eyed Joe. If you love that old-fashioned fiddle, this ones for you. It has some turns and toe taps. Dancers usually face one
