# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Every September, the life insurance industry, led by Life Happens, comes together to sponsor Life Insurance Awareness Month. This year, 2023, is the Twentieth Anniversary of the program. Nearly 4 in 10 families would face financial hardship within six months if the primary wage earner died. For 1 in 5 families, this financial hardship would occur in just one month. Nearly 20% of middle-income households rely on two incomes to make ends meet. One third of middle-income Americans wish their spouse or partner had more life insurance coverage. The majority of parents (59%) own life insurance, up five percentage points from 2022, and significantly higher than the general population (52%). Among those parents who own life insurance, 56% say the primary reason they own it is to cover burial costs and final expenses. The top reason people give for not purchasing coverage is that it is too expensive. Yet more than half of Americans overestimate the cost of life insurance three-fold. Life insurance is not for the people who die, it is for the people who live.

Did you know that William Howard Taft, our 27th President, was born on September 15, 1857? He was born in Cincinnati, Ohio into a politically active family. His father had served as President Ulysses S Grant's secretary of war. Taft attended college at Yale University, graduating second in his class. He then earned his law degree at the Cincinnati Law School in 1880. He served in private practice for a while and as solicitor general to President Benjamin Harrison before joining the faculty at Yale University, where he taught law until 1900. In 1900, President William McKinley appointed Taft as governor of the Philippines. Next, he served as secretary of war under President Theodore Roosevelt. In 1909, Taft was elected the nation's 27<sup>th</sup> president and served until 1913. While president, he quietly continued Teddy

Roosevelt's policy of busting monopolies in the steel and railroad industries and created the first federal Department of Labor to promote the welfare of America's workers. After retiring from the presidency, he became the first and only former president to serve as chief justice of the Supreme Court. President Warren Harding appointed Taft to the court in 1921. He held that position for nine years. As chief justice, Taft gave the oath of office to Presidents Calvin Coolidge and Herbert Hoover at their inaugurations in 1923 and 1929. Health complications led to Taft's resignation as chief justice in February 1930. He died one month later, on March 3, from heart failure. President Taft was the 7th of 8 presidents elected from Ohio, earning Ohio the nickname "the Mother of Presidents". Some dispute Ohio's claiming 8 presidents as William Henry Harrison, the 9th President and grandfather to Benjamin Harrison, the 23rd President, was born in Virginia. Harrison, however, lived in Ohio when he was elected as president. President Taft was the first former president to be buried in Arlington National Cemetery. He was also the first president to throw out the ceremonial first pitch at a baseball game in 1910.

# Don't fall for the debt collector scam

Sometimes scammers try to get you to pay for debts you don't owe or don't exist at all.

That's a debt collection scam -- but you can and should check on the collector and the supposed debt before you pay.

If a debt collector calls you, he or she is required to provide a debt validation notice within five days. This will give the name of the collection agency, the creditor, the account number connected to the debt, and the amount of the debt.

If you don't believe you owe the debt, you can send a letter requesting that the collector provide clear evidence of the debt.

Never share any personal information, like a social security number, with a debt collector. You should also check your credit report.

Always contact the creditor and, in the case of a supposed medical debt, your insurance company.

Some tip-offs that a collection is a scam:

• The collector threatens you with arrest or jail time. Legitimate collection companies don't do this because it violates the law.

• They demand immediate payment.

• They insist you pay by a gift card, wire transfer or a pre-paid debit card. These are virtually untraceable methods, which scammers love.
