It is that time of year that we remind our members that it is not too late to make their 2015 contribution into their ATS IRA. Deposits must be made by this year's tax filing deadline of April 18th. If you do not have an ATS Traditional or Roth IRA and have earned income, we recommend that you start one now! Both the Traditional and Roth IRA allow you to enjoy tax advantages while saving for your future.

# Traditional vs. Roth

With a Traditional IRA, you contribute pre-tax money, reducing your taxable income for the year, and thereby reducing your taxes, too. (Taxable income of \$60,000 and a \$5,000 contribution? Presto -- \$55,000 in taxable income for the year.) The money grows in your account and is taxed at your ordinary income tax rate when you withdraw it in retirement.

With a ROTH IRA, all withdrawals are tax free assuming you are over 59 1/2 years old and your IRA has been open for at least five years. Contributions must be made with earned money. There's no minimum age for opening a Roth, but whoever funds one, whether child or adult, must do so with earned income. For kids, allowance or birthday money doesn't qualify, but cash earned through babysitting or odd jobs can. For adults, qualified earnings include wages, commissions, and even alimony payments, but not inheritances, pension or disability income, or Social Security benefits.

# **IRA contribution limits**

The IRA contribution limits are the same for both the 2015 and 2016 tax years: \$5,500 -- plus an extra \$1,000 "catchup" contribution for those age 50 or older.

# **Eligibility limits**

The IRS has specific rules regarding who can contribute to an IRA. Traditional IRAs and Roth IRAs base certain eligibility guidelines on the taxpayer's Modified Adjusted Gross Income, which is calculated when you file your taxes.

Roth IRA limits for 2015 and beyond include income limits, too, as the ability to contribute to a Roth IRA is reduced or eliminated for high earners. Single filers with modified adjusted gross income (AGI) of less than \$116,000, and married couples who file jointly and have AGIs of less than \$183,000, are safe. Partial contributions for a single filer limits are 116,000—131,000 and joint filers partial contribution limits are \$183,000—\$193,000.

Roth IRA 2016 contribution limits for a single filer are up to \$117,000 and for partial contributions \$117,000-

\$132,000. For joint filers the limit is up to \$184,000 and for partial contributions limits are \$184,000-\$194,000.

With traditional IRAs, people earning any level of income can contribute to them, but there are income-based limits on how much one can *deduct* for contributions to a traditional IRA. Thus, the overall effect is similar to Roth IRA income limits, reducing the usefulness of these tax-advantaged retirement accounts for wealthier folks.

If you're thinking that it's February 2016 and it is too late to make a contribution to your IRA for 2015, you're in luck: The deadline for IRA contributions is actually the same as your tax-filing deadline, April 18. Thus, if you didn't make a contribution in 2015, you can make two in 2016, as long as you specify that one is for 2015 and you make it by April 18.

You Are Never Too Young to Start Saving for Retirement!
