A highlight of the ATS Convention is the Saxon Handicraft Exhibit. The Exhibit this year will be held at the Salem Saxon Club, where the ATS Convention will meet on May 14 - 15, 2016.

The Junior Category, which allows our junior members, ages 13 and under, to exhibit their handcrafted items in an open category will once again be a part of the Exhibit. All members competing in this category will receive a small token of appreciation.




"Frank," he said, "I have good news and bad news."

Etymologischer Spaziergang (19): Ech hun den Bräf zagepickt

In Deutschland versteht kaum jemand, warum die Vignette, die ein Autofahrer auf Österreichs Autobahnen als Zeichen der bezahlten Maut an die Windschutzscheibe kleben muss, "Pickerl" heißt. Wer aber unsere Mundart spricht, versteht die Bezeichnung ohne Mühe, denn picken bedeutet im Siebenbürgisch-Sächsischen "kleben". Pickich Fänger sind klebrige Finger, en pickich Mängsch ist ein Mensch, der an uns klebt, und Pickes bezeichnet Klebstoff.

Das Wort picken ist ein Lehnwort aus dem Lateinischen und leitet sich von "pix" (Genetiv: "picis") = Pech ab. Pech wurde zum "Verpichen" von Bootsplanken gebraucht, um das Boot wasserdicht zu machen, und wenn jemand etwas besonders dringend haben oder tun will, so hängt oder klebt er an seiner Zielvorstellung, er ist "darauf erpicht". "Ausgepicht" wie ein gut abgedichtetes Fass oder ein Bottich ist ein perfekter, gerissener Gauner. Ech hun Pech gehuet = "Ich habe Pech gehabt", sagt man nach einem Missgeschick, sagt man, wenn etwas schief gelaufen ist. Der "Pechvogel" ist ein Mensch, der häufig Pech hat, es kann auch ein Vogel gemeint sein, der sich auf eine mit Pech bestrichene Rute setzt und festpickt.


