Since 1960 Schloss Horneck has housed the Siebenbürger Museum, the Siebenbürger Library and Archive, the Siebenbürger-Institut and is the base for many Saxon organizations. A seniors home is also located on the property. Last September the Verband der Siebenbürger Sachsen in Deutschland purchased the property for one million Euro. Donations were received from individuals and organizations to help fund the purchase of the property. The purchase of Schloss Horneck gives the Siebenbürger Saxons throughout the world a central location where Saxon artifacts, books and other historical documents can be collected and stored to preserve our ethnic history for many years.

The Federation of Transylvanian Saxons is asking for donations from all Saxons and Saxon organizations to help in funding of this historical facility. Summer is rapidly approaching and the ATS Youth Activities Committee is once again sponsoring Saxon Summer Camp, for our Junior Members and friends, ages 7-17, the opportunity to spend a week together in fellowship. This year we are extending the ages from 7-17 by offering four camp programs for the different ages. The programs are designed to allow campers to continue to grow, every time they move to a new age group the type and level of activities increase to meet the needs of that age

New Adventurers - Ages 7-8 Songs, creek stomping, hiking, swimming, crafts, discovery time, camp fires and more. Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$165 and \$300 for non-member children.

Discoverers – Ages 9–11 Traditional camp activities plus climbing tower and archery.

Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$185 and \$320 for non-member children

Journeyers - Ages 12-14 Includes traditional camp activities plus canoeing, high rope courses and zip line. Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$240 and \$375 for non-member children

Ultimate Challenge - Ages 15-17 Includes camping out at Ohiopyle, Pa, go whitewater rafting and caving at Laurel Caverns. Cost: ATS Junior Member is \$315 and \$450 for non-member children

The one week camp will be held at Camp Frederick, a beautiful camp located in Rogers, Ohio on 144 acres of forest, rambling streams, rolling hills, glacial rocks and meadows. Camp Frederick is an organized camp center located at the Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia border. The camp is located 1 ½ miles east of Rogers, Ohio off SR 154. The address is 6996 Millrock Road. The camp is staffed with trained and experienced counselors.

At Camp Frederick our campers will be housed in Cabins which accommodate eight persons.

One evening will be devoted to Saxon folk dancing and folklore.

We welcome our members to bring along one friend who is not a member. Also, ATS members may send their children or grandchildren (who are not yet ATS members) to the camp at the non-member cost. Each Camper will receive a free Saxon Summer Camp T-Shirt.


American manufacturers are now promoting towel warmers, some with aromatherapy and other perks.

Refinance your home, renovate and get a tax deduction

For homeowners wanting to refinance, the IRS usually requires that mortgage points, or prepaid interest, be amortized over the lifetime of the loan.

There's one exception, says Eric J. Wexler, a Rockville, Md., tax attorney and CPA.

If a portion of the refinanced mortgage proceeds is put toward home improvements, the points related to the home improvement amount may be deducted in the tax year of the refinance.

That is assuming the amount falls below the \$100,000 deduction limit and that other IRS requirements have been met, Wexler says.

Why is June 14 designated National Flag Day?

If you were stopped on the street by a reporter, how would you answer this question? With a shrug? Sadly, you're not alone.

Our veterans and current military are the most knowledgeable because they have fought to protect what it represents.

This June, we have the opportunity to proclaim our respect and honor for our country by flying the flag, attending a Flag Day parade or teaching our children why we're doing

President Woodrow Wilson established June 14, 100 years ago, as a day to fly our flag with pride. His speech could be proclaimed in 2016 as well as in 1916.

"I...suggest and request that throughout the nation and in every community, the 14th day of June be observed as Flag Day.

"There should be special patriotic exercises to express our thoughtful love of America, our comprehension of the great mission of liberty and justice to which we have devoted ourselves as a people, our pride and our enthusiasm for the political program of the nation,



our determination to make it greater and purer with each generation, and our resolution to demonstrate to all the world its sentiment and purpose."

On June 14, 1777, the design of our first national flag was approved by Congress. It has been modified 27 times since then. Old Glory, the starspangled banner, has flown since 1959, when President Eisenhower ordered the 50th star for Hawaii, the last state to join the USA.

"God bless America, land that I love," Irving Berlin's 1938 song of personal thanks, is still worthy of being our personal sentiment of patriotism.

Be sure your retirement advisor is a 'fiduciary'

New rules imposed by the Department of Labor require anyone being paid to provide advice on retirement accounts must do the right thing for his or her clients.

The rules are likely to reduce costs and improve returns for savers and retirees, but they raise a new risk: investment sales people may use the term "fiduciary" as a marketing tool.

Under the law, a fiduciary must be impartial, seek diligently to avoid conflicts of interest, disclose any remaining conflicts, and always serve the best interests of their clients.

The rules don't oblige sales people to act on your behalf, nor do they prevent them from calling themselves "financial advisors" when they aren't registered.

Now almost everyone getting paid to handle a retirement account must act as a fiduciary, but it's up to investors to ensure that they behave like one.

When you can own the entire U.S. stock market for as little as 0.03 percent a year, it's odd that someone calling himself or herself a fiduciary would charge you many times that rate.

At Boston University, law professor Tamar Frankel says fees should be reasonable, but the law doesn't define that precisely. Advisors that recommend non traded securities are questionable and they may still have conflicts of interest. And some charge 1 percent even on clients' cash balances when clients could earn more on certificates of deposit.

The advisor to hire is one who thinks humbly and deeply

Reading of the Minutes from the 104th Convention

A motion was made by Helen Aeling, Branch 8, Alliance, seconded by Florence Spack, Branch 18, to dispense with the reading of the Minutes of the 104th ATS Convention. Motion carried.

Induction or Dissolution of Branches

There was no induction or dissolution of Branches.

Board of Director's Reports

The Delegates were asked to hear all reports and then vote on them collectively.

President's Report

President Tom Manning gave the President's report. He announced that the ATS has begun to accept automatic electronic payments for life and annuity deposits.

Total assets at the end of 2015 were increased by \$3 million dollars and net income gained over \$0.5 million for the fourth straight year. The ratio of surplus to total admitted assets is 10.01% which demonstrates the strength of ATS finances. He noted that there is increased regulatory oversight of fraternal benefit societies requiring additional financial reporting, corporate governance filings, and monitoring of operational policies and procedures.

Although the financial picture remains strong, membership continues to decline and President Manning asked the delegation to encourage family and friends to become members of the ATS. Finally, he thanked the local Branch Officers, ATS Board of Directors and the Home Office Staff for their support and assistance in keeping the ATS strong.

Secretary's Report

Secretary Weber gave the Secretary's Report. During 2015, there were 102 new members, 24 additional certificates, 81 surrenders or lapses and 123 deaths. The total number of life and annuity certificates was 8,492 and membership was 7,106. Total life insurance value of the ATS at December 31, 2015 was \$26,351,989. The total ATS annuity value at December 31, 2015 was \$61,949,571.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Denise Crawford gave the Treasurer's Report. The 2015 Annual Financial Statement has been filed with the State of Ohio Insurance Department. Total assets at December 31, 2015 were \$85,547,627. Included in assets are \$67,113,980 of bonds, \$1,072,234 common

stock, \$2,082,619 other invested assets and \$13,973,457 of cash and short-term investments. Liabilities were ordinary for an insurance company. Unassigned funds were \$8,659,698 as of December 31, 2015. Life and annuity income was \$2,998,421, which was an increase of \$748,938 from year end 2014. Investment income for 2015 was \$4,228,991. Benefits paid out to members were \$3,258,767, remaining expenses totaled \$638,059. Gain from operations was \$624,013 with capital gains of \$1,399 which yielded a net income from operations of \$625,412 for 2015.

Quarterly financial statements and Management Discussion and Analysis Reports are also filed with the Ohio Insurance Department. Cash Flow Testing Report that is prepared by ATS Actuary Howie Heidorn is filed annually which describes various financial scenarios for the next twenty-five years is also submitted. In addition there is an annual audit prepared by an outside public accounting firm and the Ohio Insurance Department conducts an audit every three to five years. During the 2015 Ohio Insurance Department audit there were no discrepancies found in our financial reports. Treasurer Crawford concluded with a statement about the need to increase insurance sales.

Audit Report

Trustee Barbara Spack gave the Audit Committee's Report. She stated that the Trustees examined the ATS income and expense records and statements at the Annual Audit. In the opinion of the Trustees, all records and reports were accurate and in good order.

During 2015, James G. Zupka CPA, Inc. conducted an independent Auditor's Report for the fiscal year 2014 and found that the financial statements fairly represent the financial position of the ATS as of year-end 2014.

In addition, Annual and Quarterly Financial Statements are filed each year with the National Association of Insurance Commissions and the State Insurance Departments of Ohio, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Illinois, and Michigan.

A motion was made by Susanna Fleischer., Branch 37, Detroit, seconded by Arline Suts, Branch 33, Cleveland, to accept the Board of Directors reports. Motion carried.

Report of the Committee on Rules

Trustee Barbara Spack presented the budget proposals for a two-year period of 2016 – 2018:

Salary \$350,000 Sales Promotion \$60,000 Fraternal Activities \$55,000

She reminded the Delegates that the budget proposals will be voted on later in the session.

Reports by Standing and Special Committees

President Manning asked that all reports be presented and then acted upon collectively.

Investment Committee

Treasurer Denise Crawford presented the Investment Committee report. During 2015, eight sets of bonds were purchased with a cost of \$3,784,210. Six sets of bonds were sold, called, matured or redeemed with proceeds of \$1,421,777 and a net realized capital loss of \$26,709. The loss was due to the proactive sale of two bonds that were thought to be heading toward a potential downgrade. Two issues of stocks were purchased, and one issue of stock was sold with a gain of \$31,619. At December 31, 2015, the current yield on the ATS investment portfolio was 4.72%. Annuity interest rates will remain at minimum guarantees until such time that the interest on the ATS investment portfolio increases. The Investment Committee relies on the advice of our long-time investment advisor, John McPike.

The 2015 Investment Committee consisted of: President Thomas Manning, Robert Cunningham, Joan Miller-Malue, Randall Floyd, and Denise Crawford.

Orphan Fund Committee

Robert Cunningham, Chairman of the Orphan Fund Committee gave the report. The Orphan Fund was established at the ATS Convention in 1915. The Orphan Fund benefit program provides monthly financial assistance for orphaned children of ATS members or for orphaned juvenile members through age 18 or age 21 if handicapped.

In 2015 there were 8 children from 4 families being supported at a monthly cost of \$460.00. The total spent in 2015 was \$4,920 and \$201 was received via donations. The Orphan Fund Committee consists of the three Vice




Make sure college students get salary data

Some college graduates are wishing they majored in a field that paid higher salaries. Who knew a poet or third-world advisor would hardly be able to pay off student loans?

Economics professor Matthew Wiswall of Arizona State University decided to ask students what they thought earnings for various fields were in the real world. And he asked how much they wanted to earn by age 30.

When presented with actual salary information, 12 percent of them decided to change their intended major. Wiswall says pay differences made a greater impact than graduation rates.

The lack of students pursuing technology, engineering and medical degrees shows that students aren't totally driven by dollars in spite of the prospect of higher pay and steady work.
