
BRANCH 5, LORAIN By Michael Johnson

Transylvanian Saxon History Trivia: Samuel von Brukenthal (1721-1803) was the only representative of the Transylvanian Saxon community who acceded to high public office in the Austrian Empire under the Empress Maria Theresia (1717 – 1780), the first such office being that of Chancellor of Transylvania. Samuel von Brukenthal was the governor of Transylvania from 1773 to 1778. His home, a large palace in Hermannstadt, is currently home to the Brukenthal National Museum (formed around the collections he gathered, and expanded from a public exhibit first opened in 1817). The Samuel von Brukenthal Gymnasium is the oldest German school in Romania. The present building was erected in the 18th century.

A seniors home is also located on the property. Last September the Verband der Siebenbürger Sachsen in Deutschland purchased the property for one million Euro.



Donations were received from individuals and organizations to help fund the purchase of the property. The purchase of Schloss Horneck gives the Siebenbürger Saxons throughout the world a central location where Saxon artifacts, books and other historical documents can be collected and stored to preserve our ethnic history for many years.

ATS OPEN-BOWLING TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. All bowlers must be Alliance of Transylvanian Saxon members in good standing to participate in this tournament.
- 2. Each bowler will receive 100% of the difference between his or her average and a two hundred ten (210) scratch with no limit on pins.
- 3. Averages to be used are:
 - a) The average of the past five years' tournaments.
 - b) If the bowler has no tournament average then the bowler will establish his or her average after the first three games rolled in the tournament, which will remain the bowler's average for the remainder of the tournament.
- 4. A bowler may bowl only once in each event in this tournament.
- 5. The tournament management has the right to return for correction any entry, which does not comply with the above rules.
- 6. Prizes will be awarded at the ratio of at least one (1) prize for each ten entries. One hundred percent of the prize fee must be returned. Prizes will be awarded by handicapped scores and not by gender.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the tournament manager to keep a running record of all bowlers' averages participating in each event.
- 8. Tournament starts on October 22 and ends on October 23, 2016.
- 9. Closing date for entries is October 12, 2016.
- 10. There will be no refunds of fees after October 19, 2016.
- 11. All Event Winners will be determined by actual scores bowled.
- 12. We will start with Doubles Event followed by the Singles Event on Saturday.

All Events will be a handicap event this year. Your all events final score will be your total individual score of singles, doubles, and team event plus your handicap total for the tournament.

Separate men and women prizes will only be awarded in Singles event only. Doubles and team will be mixed.

Please note: There is no adult beverage or food service available at the bowling alley; you are welcome to bring your own.







The History of Labor Day

Labor Day is dedicated to the American worker and is a tribute to the American labor movement. The first suggestion of a day set aside to honor workers came from Peter J. McGuire in the 1880s. McGuire was the general secretary of the Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners and also a cofounder of the American Federation of Labor. He suggested a day to thank and commemorate those who had "delved and carved all the grandeur we behold."

It was the Central Labor Union in New York City, however, that actually held the first public Labor Day holiday. On Tuesday, September 5, 1882, a demonstration and picnic was held, with a second one the following year. In 1884, the labor union suggested commemorating this "workingman's holiday" on the first Monday in September.

By 1886, many cities were recognizing Labor Day. Oregon was the first state to officially recognize the holiday in 1887. Finally, in 1894, twelve years after that first Labor Day, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September of every year a legal holiday.

The most common observance of Labor Day around the country is similar to that first one--street parades, festivals, and picnics. The greatest asset of a nation is its people, and it is fitting that every year on Labor Day, tribute is paid to those who have helped make America strong and prosperous.

OCD treatment hope

Scientists at Duke University have found that blocking one neurotransmitter in the brain stopped obsessive-compulsive behavior in minutes.

According to the journal Biological Psychiatry, Duke researchers experimented with mice bred to exhibit anxiety and obsessive behavior. Mice were given a drug that blocked one neurotransmitter, mGluR5. The obsessive behavior stopped within minutes. More research is needed.

Speed training games might aid thinking

Claims made for online brain exercises have mostly been debunked, but a new 10year study found that speed training, might ward off dementia.

Speed training attempts to help people make quicker decisions in their field of view and expand their field of view. This skill is used in driving, for example.

The study, presented by the



University of South Florida, claims that only 10 hours of training resulted in a 33 percent lower risk of developing dementia.

Posit Science now offers the speed training program, called Double Decision, on its fee-based BrainHQ online program.

The study findings have not yet been published or peer-reviewed.
