Did you know the first official Groundhog Day was celebrated in 1887? According to History.com, a newspaper editor, belonging to a group of businessmen and groundhog hunters known as the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club, declared that Phil, the Punxsutawney groundhog, was America's only true weather-forecasting groundhog. Tradition has it that if a groundhog comes out of its hole on February 2 and sees its shadow, it gets scared and runs back into its burrow, predicting six more weeks of winter weather. No shadow means an early spring. That inaugural groundhog saw his shadow and became the bearer of bad news.

Falling midway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox, February 2 is a significant day in several ancient and modern traditions. The Celts celebrated Imbolc from February 1 through sundown

on February 2. This was a pagan festival marking the beginning of spring. As Christianity spread through Europe, Imbolc evolved into Candlemas. This ancient Christian tradition was when clergy would bless and distribute candles needed for winter. The candles represented how long and cold the winter would be. It was also an ancient purification holiday and a celebration of the return to light after the winter's darkness. In certain parts of Europe, Christians believed that a sunny Candlemas meant another 40 days of cold and snow. Germans expanded on this concept by selecting an animal, a badger or hedgehog, as a means of predicting weather. Once they came to America, German settlers in Pennsylvania continued the tradition. However, they switched from hedgehogs to the native groundhog, which were plentiful in the state. Groundhogs, also known

as woodchucks, typically weigh 12 to 15 pounds and live six to eight years. They eat fruits and vegetables, whistle when they are frightened or looking for a mate, and can climb trees and swim. They go into hibernation in the late fall. During this time, their body temperatures drop greatly; their heartbeats slow from 80 beats per minute to 5 beats per minute and can lose 30 percent of their body fat. In February, male groundhogs emerge, not to predict the weather, but to look for a mate. They head back underground again and come out of hibernation for good in March.

Currently, the yearly festivities in Punxsutawney are presided over by a group of local dignitaries known as the Inner Circle. The members wear top hats and conduct the official proceedings in the Pennsylvania Dutch dialect. The movie Groundhog Day popularized the usage of "groundhog day" to mean something that is repeated over and over. That movie, however, was filmed in Woodstock, Illinois, and not Pennsylvania. How accurate is Phil? Apparently, he has a dismal success rate of just 40 percent. Ohio's Buckeye Chuck has a much better accuracy rate of 80%. Let's all hope for an early spring!



Five of our ATS Members will have the chance to attend the 2024 Jugendlager, which will be held in Canada starting on Friday, July 5 and ending on Friday, July 19. Armouncements and applications have been mailed to our ATS Members ages 16-20.

Participants from Austria, Canada, Germany, Transylvania, and the United States will enjoy two weeks of learning about our Saxon history and culture as well as sightseeing in the beautiful country of Canada. Housing will be provided by the host country and participants will be housed with Saxon families and motels during their stay in Kitchener-Waterloo and in Aylmer. Details of the itinerary are not yet completed.

Participation in this Jugendlager will be limited to five young people from each country, along with one Group Leader. Participants from the USA must be ATS members in good standing between ages of 16-20. Each participant will bear the cost of their transportation to and from Canada and personal daily incidental expenses. The ATS will pay the Participation Fee for each of the USA participants.

Participants must have a valid passport or passcard and provide proof of medical insurance coverage.

All applicants should be interested in learning about our Saxon culture and traditions and be familiar with their Saxon background. They should also be knowledgeable about the activities of their local branch and the national organization, the Alliance of Transylvanian Saxons.

This is a two-week program that offers an individual a chance to share their family history with others, to learn about our Saxon heritage, and to make friends that will last a lifetime.







### Work up a sweat to protect your brain

Harvard researchers have come to some conclusions about how much exercise will protect you from dementia. They say people engaging in moderate to heavy physical activity are 45 percent less likely to develop any kind of brain problems. In the study, activities were categorized in three categories:

• Light: standing and walking.



• Moderate: faster walking, housework, yard chores, climbing stairs and light sports, such as bowling and golf.

• Heavy: major housework and intense activities like jogging.

One way the study was different from others: It mainly focused on older people. Other studies included people of all ages. This study shows that even for older people, moderate exercise is protective.
