PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In addition to participants for the Jugendlager in Canada this summer, the ATS is also looking for a Group Leader. Candidates must have a valid passport and medical insurance, be interested in sharing their family's Saxon traditions, be knowledgeable about the activities of their local branch and the ATS, and have knowledge of foreign travel. German language skills are a plus. Preferred age is between 25 and 35. The dates of the Jugendlager are July 5 – 19, 2024. We have a few more seats available on the bus trip to Transylvania this summer. If your passport is up to date and you wish to travel with us, please call the ATS Home Office before March 1. Our travel dates are July 31 to August 10. The highlight of the trip will be the Sachsentreffen to be held in Hermannstadt on August 2-4.

Branch Secretaries: Did you mail your 2024 Branch Officer roster to the ATS Home Office? Every Branch and Cultural Group is required to complete and mail this form to the office. This form is what we use to print contact information in the back of the Volksblatt for your Branch or Group. You should include someone for each position: Officers, ATS Secretary, Dues Secretary, Youth Representative, etc., and your meeting time and place. Mailings from the Home Office are directed to different people in your Branch or Group, depending on the mailing. Thanks to those Branches and Groups who have already submitted theirs.

Did you know that on February 15, 1898, the USS Maine exploded in Cuba's Havana harbor and was the beginning of the Spanish American war? An immense explosion of unknown origin sunk the battleship, killing 260 American crewmembers aboard. The USS Maine was one of the first American battleships. It weighed 6,000 tons and cost more than \$2 million to build. The Maine was on a friendly visit to Cuba to protect American interests and civilians after a rebellion against Spanish rule broke out in Havana in January of 1898. According to History.com, an official US Naval Court of Inquiry ruled in March 1898 that a mine blew up the ship, without directly blaming Spain.

Sensationalist newspaper articles and advocates of war galvanized the American public with the rallying cry "Remember the Maine". This was a time referred to as "yellow journalism" when the reporting style from the press helped fuel not only the Americans' enthusiasm for the conflict abroad, but also fervent nationalism on the home front. The term grew out of a feud between two prominent newspaper publishers, William Randolph Hearst and Joseph Pulitzer, both from New York City. One publisher created a comic strip featuring a boy in a yellow nightshirt entitled "The Yellow Kid". The other publisher poached the Yellow Kid, and it continued showing up in both publications. Both newspapers were abundant with highly embellished reports, many focusing on Spain's alleged

atrocities, throughout the Spanish American War.

The American public, as well as Congress, had little doubt that Spain was responsible and a declaration of war was called for. Subsequent diplomatic attempts to resolve the matter of the USS Maine failed, along with the US's indignation over Spain's brutal suppression of the Cuban rebellion and continued losses to American investments. President William McKinley reluctantly signed a resolution supporting Cuban independence and threatening Spain with military action, leading to the outbreak of the Spanish-American War in April 1898.

Within three months, the United States had decisively defeated the Spanish forces on land and sea. In August 1898, an armistice halted the fighting. On December 12, 1898, the United States and Spain signed the Treaty of Paris, officially ending the Spanish-American War. This Treaty granted the United States its first overseas empire with the ceding of former Spanish possessions such as Puerto Rico, Guam, and the Philippines.

During the Spanish-American War, another "yellow" item played a big part. The War claimed the lives of 3,000 Americans, but only a small portion of these soldiers died in combat. Yellow

fever and typhoid decimated entire units, spreading swiftly through camps in the Caribbean and the southeastern United States. IIIness had already ravaged the Spanish forces even before the conflict began, leaving only 55,000 of the 230,000 Spanish troops healthy enough to fight. After the war, the US Army set up a commission to investigate the yellow fever problem, which continued to plague thousands of men still stationed in Cuba. Overseen by Walter Reed, scientists conducted experiments outside Havana that proved for the first time that mosquitoes spread the potentially fatal sickness, rather than direct physical contact. The Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, DC, (now known as the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda, MD) was named after this US Army physician.

By the way, in 1976, a team of American naval investigators concluded that the USS Maine explosion was probably caused by a fire that ignited the ammunition stockpile, rather than a Spanish mine or act of sabotage.







FEDERATION OF THE TRANSYLVANIAN SAXONS' INTERNATIONAL JUGENDLAGER JULY 5 – 19, 2024 HOST COUNTRY: CANADA

Five of our ATS Members will have the chance to attend the 2024 Jugendlager, which will be held in Canada starting on Friday, July 5 and ending on Friday, July 19. Announcements and applications have been mailed to our ATS Members ages 16-20.

Participants from Austria, Canada, Germany, Transylvania, and the United States will enjoy two weeks of learning about our Saxon history and culture as well as sightseeing in the beautiful country of Canada. Housing will be provided by the host country and participants will be housed with Saxon families and motels during their stay in Kitchener-Waterloo and in Aylmer. Details of the itinerary are not yet completed.

Participation in this Jugendlager will be limited to five young people from each country, along with one Group Leader. Participants from the USA must be ATS members in good standing between ages of 16-20. Each participant will bear the cost of their transportation to and from Canada and personal daily incidental expenses. The ATS will pay the Participation Fee for each of the USA participants.


Participants must have a valid passport or passcard and provide proof of medical insurance coverage.





EINTRACHT SINGING SOCIETY, NEW CASTLE By Danual Forsberg


