### Super Bowls

Having the gang over for the big game? Give yourself a break this year, so you can enjoy the day too! These dips are crowd-pleasing and are the easiest snack you can make.

### Hot Stuff

Blend one 8-ounce package of softened cream cheese and a half a bottle of hot chili sauce together in a blender or food processor. Serve with crackers.

### Baked Onion Dip

Lightly grease a 1-quart baking dish. In a bowl, mix one 8-ounce package of shredded Cheddar cheese, 2 cups of mayonnaise, and 2 cups of chopped onion.

Place in the baking dish and sprinkle the top with 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese. Bake for 40 to 45 minutes, or until the onions are tender and the top is lightly browned. Serve with crackers.

### Beer Cheese Dip

With a mixer, whip together one 8-ounce package of softened cream cheese, one 8-ounce package of diced processed cheese food (like Velveeta), a half a can of room temperature beer, and one peeled and crushed clove of garlic. Continue whipping until smooth. Serve with crackers.

### Tex Mex Dip

In a bowl, combine one cup of shredded Cheddar cheese, one 16-ounce container of sour cream, one 4-ounce can of chopped green chile peppers, and one 1-ounce package of taco seasoning mix. Chill in the refrigerator for two hours before serving.



### **Travel Bag** Battle for overhead bin space

Caused by bag fees, crowded planes and limited space for carry ons, flight attendants say there is a problem.

One attendant claims passengers with carry ons create a scene that resembles TV shows like The Amazing Race. They charge into the planes in order to stow their gear before others fill the bins. They drag bags that are heavier than allowed, slip aboard with more than two bags, and bump into seatmates while cramming their belongings into the overhead bin.

Travelers often break the rules of bag limits, according to flight attendants quoted in USA Today.

Another problem develops when passengers delay others because their carry on is too heavy to lift. Other passengers have to come to their rescue.

The last passengers to board the plane may find no place left to stow their stuff. The problem is so serious that Congress is considering legislation to limit carry on size and ensure enforcement at TSA airport checkpoints.

Airlines usually limit carryons to one of varying size and one of a smaller size such as a purse or a computer case.

New Year's traditions are very different in many countries and are based on centuries of belief and superstitions. Good fortune and bad luck both influence the choice of food eaten as the New Year celebration begins. As we all know our ethnic choice is pork and sauerkraut, which is also associated with good luck. The sauerkraut is considered a cooked green (cabbage) also kale, chard or challards. Their green leaves look like folded money and thus symbolic of economic fortune. The Danish eat stewed kale sprinkled with sugar and cinnamon, while in the southern states collards are the green of choice. It is widely believed that the more greens one eats the larger ones fortune will be that year.

Some may wonder why the pig became associated with the idea of good luck. In Europe hundreds of years ago, wild boars were killed on the first day of the year and may also be associated with getting plenty to eat. Pork is served all over the world mainly because of the belief that pigs symbolize prosperity and abundance because of their plump bodies and high fat content. It may also be the reasoning that they push themselves forward as they root around with their snouts in the dirt for food. This motion of pushing forward is a sign of good fortune unlike the chicken, which is thought of as misfortune because it scratches backward. It is also thought that this will cause too much dwelling on the past. Another theory warns against eating any winged fowl because gook luck could flyaway.

Fish is another very logical choice for the New Year's table for cod has been a popular feast food since the Middle Ages. Fish is considered a lucky food as those in the northwestern part of the U.S. may eat salmon, while some Germans and Poles choose herring or even carp. Some Germans have even been known to place a few fish scales in their wallets for good luck. Eew! How could they consider this lucky? Can you imagine what their wives might think to find this treasure in their hubby's wallet?

Like most round foods, beans symbolize money and prosperity in many cultures. But the type of bean depends on where you live. Italians eat green lentils with their pork and sausages. while the southern states eat black-eved peas. Mexico and other Spanish-speaking countries believe in eating one grape at each stroke leading up to midnight for good luck. They eat 12 grapes, one for each month and if the grape for one month is sweet it is considered to be a good month if sour, it of course will be a bad one.

One favorite for all cultures choice is pastries and cakes, which we all agree is a great way to celebrate any occasion. Any excuse to enjoy our wonderful Saxon pastries is fine for all of us! Round cakes, of course, are considered lucky, especially the person who gets the slice with a silver or gold coin hidden inside. Such cakes are a tradition in Greece made with yeast dough flavored with lemon.

Beef Stroganoff dates back to the 19th century. Although not a new recipe, it is a refined version of an older Russian dish that had probably been in the family of Count Pavel Stroganoff for some years. It became well known through his love of entertaining.

Count Stroganoff was a dignitary at the court of Alexander III, a member of the Imperial Academy of Arts, and a known gourmet. Legend has it that Count Stroganoff had lost all his teeth and his chef had prepared this recipe specially for him.

It is doubtful that it was the chef's invention since the recipe was included in the 1871 Molokhovets cookbook. Here's a new twist on the

Shrimp Stroganoff 20 to 25 cooked and deveined shrimp

3 tablespoons flour 1 1/2 teaspoons salt

- 7 tablespoons butter
- 2 cups fresh sliced mushrooms 1/2 cup chopped onions
- 1 teaspoon garlic buds 4 ounce can tomato paste
- 8 ounce tub fat-free sour cream 2 tablespoons dry white wine 1 can beef broth

1/2 teaspoon ground Hot buttered egg

noodles Saute the shrimp briefly in butter but do not overcook. Set aside
