Health in the News Study: Chemo won't help end-stage cancer patients

Families want something, maybe chemo therapy, for their family member who has terminal cancer.

A new study now shows that half of cancer patients received chemo, which causes grueling side effects, in their final months, even though it had no chance of curing them or making them feel better. Study co-author Holly Prigerson, co-director of the Center for Research on End-of-Life Care at Weill Cornell Medical college in New York, says that for the healthiest end-of-life patients, quality of life actually got worse after chemo.

The study was published in JAMA Oncology and included only people expected to live six months or less.

Cancer specialists may prescribe chemo because they assume a patient has nothing to lose and may feel better. Prigerson's study overturns that assumption. She says that in people with end-stage cancer, they found no positive outcome to chemotherapy.

A growing number of hospitals offer palliative care, a better choice, that focuses on relieving symptoms and supporting patients and their families.

Sometimes in-home hospice care is more comfortable for patients.





November is National Adoption Month

National Adoption Month is a collective effort to raise awareness of thousands of children who are in foster care. They hope for and wait for a loving family to choose them.

In 2014, more than 4,500 children in foster care were adopted by forever families in the month of November.

Foster children have stiff competition from newborns, which many individuals and couples want.

This year, more than a million pregnant American women are deciding whether to give their child a better chance in life through adoption. Some are employed single mothers who are struggling to raise their first child. They could make the wise decision to choose a set of parents to adopt the coming child so he or she can have a life with greater advantages.

There are three types of adoption:

- * Closed adoption, where the mother's identity is not revealed,
- * Semi-open adoption, where the parents and the natural parent will be known to each other and may keep in contact if they choose to do so, and
- * Open adoption in which members of the adopting family and members of natural parent's family can know each other and have as much contact as each one cares to have. Children of adopting parents may form friendships with a step brother and sister in the natural parent's family.

Stay strong by getting enough vitamin D

Doctors at the University of California, Berkeley, say vitamin D may help reduce agerelated muscle loss.

In a clinical trial recently reported in Osteoporosis International, 160 postmenopausal Brazilian women, ages 50 to 65, took 1,000 IU vitamin D capsules or a placebo.

After nine months, those taking the vitamin experienced a significant increase in leg muscle strength compared to the placebo group. They lost less lean body mass, muscle and bone.

The women initially had relatively low blood levels of vitamin D. Most people lose muscle after age 50, typically 1 to 2 percent a year.

The History of Veterans Day

November 11, or what has come to be known as Veterans Day, was originally set as a U.S. legal holiday to honor Armistice Day - the end of World War I, which officially took place on November 11, 1918. President Woodrow Wilson honored the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations..."

In 1954, Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, struck out the word "Armistice" and inserted the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

Between 1968 and 1975, Veterans Day was moved around on the calendar, sometimes even appearing on the last Monday of October. Finally on September 20, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed a law which returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of November 11, beginning in 1978.

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. The restoration of the observance of Veterans Day to November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.

As Americans, we owe a tremendous amount of gratitude to our veterans who, during peace and war, have demonstrated a steadfast commitment to safeguarding the principles upon which our nation was founded. We salute you and thank you for your service to America. Veterans Day should remind us of the solemn obligation we have to all of our veterans and their family members. For some, the challenges they face arise only after they leave the battlefield. From delays in health care and other claims to challenges in finding jobs once they return from service, our veterans today need our support more than ever.

We suggest our local branches think about starting a Saxon Veteran's organization within their local to help bring more energy into the organization. It can help your Branch get known within the local community. The Cleveland-West Branch 1 had a large veteran's organization that was formed in 1946 which provide social events for their members as well as helped to raise money to donate to various veterans' programs.
