The Bowl Where You Are Tournament was held on February 15th at Rolling Meadows. We had 14 of



Instead of using harsh chemicals to clear your clogged up drains, try a environmentally more friendly solution. Pour 1/4 cup (60 ml) baking soda into the drain. Follow with 1/2 cup (125 ml) vinegar. Close the drain and let sit for several minutes. Then flush with boiling water. If there is still a clog, you can rent a plumber's snake to feed down the drain. But take care—aggressive use of the plumber's snake can damage pipes, so only use as much force as necessary.



Bonnie J. Baker, president of Ladies Branch 22, and Dr. John Boehm Jr., past president of Branch 30, presented the awards.


The Saxon Club Culture Group Brass Band played dance music. Dave Stryffeler was program chairman.

Myers is a 1952 graduate of Austintown Fitch High School and attended Youngstown State University and comptometer school.







#### FOR 104TH CONVENTION CONSIDERATION ATS BOARD OF DIRECTORS' PROPOSED **CONSTITUTIONAL AMDENDMENTS**

The Committee on Rules reviewed the Alliance of Transylvanian Saxons' National Constitution and upon approval by the ATS Board of Directors, said Board proposes the following changes to the ATS Constitution for convention consideration. The State of Ohio Insurance Examiners had recommended the following changes to the ATS Constitution.

Article IX. Duties of Officers Section 5.

**Omit second sentence:** The Treasurer shall serve as the chairperson of the annual audit of the Board of Directors and shall recommend to the Board of Directors the appointment of the independent auditor.

At the previous Examination the State of Ohio Examiner had requested the above change, now the recent Examiners requested we change back to our original

Change to Read: The Treasurer shall be responsible for reporting all financial statistics to the Board of Directors and the Convention. The Treasurer shall review the monthly cash receipts and cash disbursement records of the Alliance.

Article IX. Duties of Officers Section 7 Trustees' duties

Currently Reads: c. They shall audit the books of the Alliance annually.

Change to Read: c. They shall serve as the Audit Committee and audit the books of the Alliance at least annually.

1) The Board of Directors shall designate an Audit Committee Chairperson and shall recommend to the Board of Directors the appointment of the independent auditor.

This approve proposal changes some of the duties that were the Treasurer to the ATS Trustees.

Article X. Board of Directors

The following proposal is recommended so that the

ATS Board of Directors can act timely and efficiently to abide by changes in Insurance Laws or Rulings by the various state insurance departments.

#### Add Section 11:

The Board of Directors shall have full authority to act in a judicial capacity. In order to comply with laws or insurance department rulings having the effect of law in any state where the Alliance is licensed for business, the Board of Directors may, by resolution, amend without national convention delegate approval any provision of this Constitution and Bylaws which nor or subsequently conflicts with any such laws or rulings. When the Board of Directors amends the Alliance's Constitution and Bylaws under this section, notice of the amendment(s) will be published in the Volksblatt, official publication of the Alliance. Amendments, from date of publication, will be binding on every member and on all those deriving legal rights from a member. Amendments will remain in effect until altered, amended, or repealed by the national convention during a regular or special session.

Please consider the above recommendations and discuss with your Branch members so that your Delegates will be prepared to make a decision at the upcoming Convention.

#### Color Easter eggs just for fun

There are some interesting Easter egg kits on the market that include color, stickers and holders. If you have children, they may want to be more involved in the egg-coloring process.

\* Easy projects include having kids use a light-colored crayon to

make drawings, lettering, patterns or dots on hard-cooked eggs before coloring. The crayon marks will stay white. For an egg with stripes, wrap it tightly with a rubber band or two before dipping it into the dye.



\*Marbled eggs: You'll need 10 hardboiled white eggs, 1/2 cup of white vinegar, and a package of vibrant

food color such as McCormick Neon. Color the eggs two at a time in a colander. First, splash them with vinegar. Drip yellow food coloring on the eggs and gently agitate a few seconds so the color will spread. Let that color stand for 30 seconds. Do the same with two or three more colors. Let them stand a minute or two before moving them to air dry on a paper towel.

\*The one-step method: For a marbled effect, wrap raw eggs in white or purple onion skins (for brown), spinach (for green), and fresh saffron (for yellow), and tie with white string. Put them all together in a nylon stocking and cover with water. Add 1/2 tablespoon of vinegar and gently boil for about 18 minutes. Leave them in their wrappers for a while, and when you take them out, they will be all different colors.

Turn colored eggs into Easter bunnies: Cut oval-shaped ears from colored paper. Glue the ears and plastic eyes to the egg. Use markers to draw a triangle for a nose and some whiskers. Glue on a cotton ball for a tail and you've got an Easter bunny.

#### And the good news is: Some caregivers are healthier than comparable non-caregivers

While it's not easy to care for a disabled or elderly person, being bombarded with reports of how caregiving can be hazardous to your health only makes things worse.

There are many positive studies, but they get less attention from the media. These

it helps some caregivers live reported enhanced self-esteem longer. reported enhanced self-esteem and recognition by others.

The latest positive news comes from a large demographic study sponsored by the National Institutes of Health. Reported in the American Journal of Epidemiology, it looked at 3,500 individuals (average age 63), who had taken care of a family member for about six years.

These caregivers had an 18 percent lower mortality rate than their matched noncaregiving counterparts. The best survival benefit was in the one-third of caregivers who were taking care of an elderly parent.

Certainly the negative effects of high-strain caregiving are recognized, but the researchers point out that the caregiving experience in incredibly diverse. Most people willingly help family members with low levels of need.

In this s t u d y o n l y o n e - sixth of caregivers said they had h i g h levels of strain.

Many

reported enhanced self-esteem and recognition by others. The study leaders say when caregiving is done willingly at manageable levels and for individuals who express gratitude, it is reasonable to expect health benefits might accrue.

We quote the final lines of this study. "Negative public health and media portrayals of the risks of family caregiving may do a disservice by portraying caregiving as dangerous. The portrayals could deter family members from taking on what could be a satisfying and healthy family role."

# How to change your view of a friend who grumbles and complains about everything

The Wall Street Journal has a personal advisor who will tell you how to handle just about anything from your cellphone problem to long lines at the airport.

Recently, Dan Ariely fielded a question from a person who met an old friend for lunch and all she did was complain during their long visit, about her husband and kids for starters.

Ariely first says complaining actually does bring you closer to a friend. Imagine you tell several friends about how bad the traffic was on your drive in. Or that your drive was wonderfully pleasant and it was easy to find parking. Which description would make your friends like you more?

When we complain, we're usually looking for reassurance, hoping others will say, for example, that everything is OK and it's just part of life.

Or your friend might have been looking to reconnect with you through shared misery. In this case, you should have indulged her efforts to strengthen your bond.

Your friend might also might have really wanted you to tell her something, like, "You think your husband is a shmuck? I'll tell you what mine did." It would assure her that her life is more normal than she might think.

Either way, according to Ariely, complaining can actually be pretty useful.

"The next time you're with a friend who starts to grumble and complain, just go along with it," he says.
