Werner was a 1949 graduate of New Castle Senior High. He earned his B.S. degree at St. Vincent College, graduating in 1953. He then pursued a Master Baker Proficiency Certification, the highest standard in the baking profession.

He and his beloved wife of 62 years, the former Betty Lou Quint, whom he married June 26, 1952, owned and operated the Danish Pastry Shop, a family business for 72 years.

Mr. Ullrich was recognized for his outstanding leadership in the business world when he received the Paul Harris Fellow Award from Rotary International. He belonged to several business and social organizations in the area: Retail Baker's Association serving as President; the New Castle Rotary Club for which he served as President from 2000 to 2001; Board of Directors of Jameson Hospital from 1982 to 2001; President and founding member of the Castle Pistol Club; life member of the Eintracht Singing Society. He enjoyed hunting and fishing for recreation and was a member of St. Camillus Church.

Besides his wife, he is survived by three sons, Werner P. Ullrich II, Charles G. Ullrich and his wife Ramona, and John A. Ullrich all of New Castle; two sisters, Gertrude Suorsa and her husband Dr. Paul Suorsa of Slippery Rock, Elizabeth Ullrich of Saratoga, FL; six grandchildren, Brittany Onufrak and her husband John, Ingrid and Jewel Ullrich, Jessica Kapsha and her husband Edward, Christine Ruano and her husband Patricio, John A. Ullrich Jr. and one great-grandson, John C. Onufrak.



A highlight of the ATS Convention is the Saxon Handicraft Exhibit. The Exhibit this year will be held at the Sawmill Creek Resort, where the ATS Convention will meet on May 17-18, 2014. Handicraft Exhibit Director is Jeanne Petty, and assistant Director is Arleen Gilles.

The Junior Category, which allows our junior members, ages 13 and under, to exhibit their handcrafted items in an open category, will once again be a part of the Exhibit. All members competing in this category will receive a small token of appreciation.

**FOR 104TH CONVENTION CONSIDERATION
ATS BOARD OF DIRECTORS' PROPOSED
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS**

The Committee on Rules reviewed the Alliance of Transylvanian Saxons' National Constitution and upon approval by the ATS Board of Directors, said Board proposes the following changes to the ATS Constitution for convention consideration. The State of Ohio Insurance Examiners had recommended the following changes to the ATS Constitution.

Article IX. Duties of Officers Section 5.

Omit second sentence: The Treasurer shall serve as the chairperson of the annual audit of the Board of Directors and shall recommend to the Board of Directors the appointment of the independent auditor.

At the previous Examination the State of Ohio Examiner had requested the above change, now the recent Examiners requested we change back to our original wording.

Change to Read: The Treasurer shall be responsible for reporting all financial statistics to the Board of Directors and the Convention. The Treasurer shall review the monthly cash receipts and cash disbursement records of the Alliance.

Article IX. Duties of Officers Section 7 Trustees' duties

Currently Reads: c. They shall audit the books of the Alliance annually.

Change to Read: c. They shall serve as the Audit Committee and audit the books of the Alliance at least annually.

1) The Board of Directors shall designate an Audit Committee Chairperson and shall recommend to the Board of Directors the appointment of the independent auditor.

This approve proposal changes some of the duties that were the Treasurer to the ATS Trustees.

Article X. Board of Directors

The following proposal is recommended so that the

ATS Board of Directors can act timely and efficiently to abide by changes in Insurance Laws or Rulings by the various state insurance departments.

Add Section 11:

The Board of Directors shall have full authority to act in a judicial capacity. In order to comply with laws or insurance department rulings having the effect of law in any state where the Alliance is licensed for business, the Board of Directors may, by resolution, amend without national convention delegate approval any provision of this Constitution and Bylaws which nor or subsequently conflicts with any such laws or rulings. When the Board of Directors amends the Alliance's Constitution and Bylaws under this section, notice of the amendment(s) will be published in the Volksblatt, official publication of the Alliance. Amendments, from date of publication, will be binding on every member and on all those deriving legal rights from a member. Amendments will remain in effect until altered, amended, or repealed by the national convention during a regular or special session.

Please consider the above recommendations and discuss with your Branch members so that your Delegates will be prepared to make a decision at the upcoming Convention.

Sächsische Organisationen rücken noch näher zusammen

Bischof Reinhart Guib aus Hermannstadt hatte für den 4. April nach Bad Kissingen eingeladen zu dem jährlichen Gespräch zwischen der Evangelischen Kirche A. B. in Rumänien (EKR) und dem Demokratischen Forum der Deutschen in Siebenbürgen einerseits, dem Verband der Siebenbürgisch-Sächsischen Heimatortsgemeinschaften (HOG), dem Verband der Siebenbürger Sachsen in Deutschland, der Gemeinschaft Evangelischer Siebenbürger Sachsen und Banater Schwaben im Diakonischen Werk der EKD (Hilfskomitee), dem Evangelischen Freundeskreis Siebenbürgen, der Gemeinschaft evangelischer Pfarrer und Pfarrfrauen aus Siebenbürgen und dem Sozialwerk des landsmannschaftlichen Verbandes andererseits.

Seit 2011 war es das vierte Gespräch in diesem Kreis, und wieder hat es seine Notwendigkeit und seine Nützlichkeit bewiesen.

Der Austausch von Informationen über den jeweiligen Partner, das Kennenlernen seiner Erfolge und Schwierigkeiten, das Festlegen von Handlungsweisen und gegebenenfalls das Fällen von Entscheidungen nach Absprache festigt die Einheit unserer Institutionen und stärkt das Gemeinschaftsbewusstsein. Auch die gegenseitige Hilfsbereitschaft nimmt zu und erleichtert auf diese Weise die Lösung von Schwierigkeiten. Deswegen sagte Bischof Guib am Ende des Gespräches: „Wir brauchen uns gegenseitig, wir gehören zusammen und wir wollen diese Einheit auch nach außen kommunizieren.“ Und Dr. Stefan Cosoroabă, der Leiter des Referates für institutionelle Kooperation der EKR, ergänzte: „Wir reden nicht nur, wir handeln auch. Der Großteil dessen, was in den Vorjahren besprochen wurde, ist auch umgesetzt worden.“ Folgerichtig wurde am Schluss des Gespräches schon der Gastgeber für das nächste Treffen in 2015, das Hilfskomitee, und der Tagungsort Mannheim festgelegt.

Das Gespräch begann mit einer Andacht, die Pfarrer Dr.

Raimar Kremer vom Evangelischen Freundeskreis, dem diesjährigen Gastgeber, gestaltete. Danach berichteten die Vertreter der einzelnen Institutionen über die Arbeit im zurückliegenden Jahr und die zu lösenden Probleme. Von der Vielzahl an Themen seien nur folgende erwähnt: In Siebenbürgen fehlen derzeit mehrere Pfarrer, stellte Bischof Guib fest. Man sei deswegen für die Tätigkeit der vom Hilfskomitee entsandten Pfarrer dankbar. Die Kirche will in 2014 ihre diakonische Arbeit verstärken, weil ihre Gemeindeglieder dieses erwarten. Seitens des Demokratischen Forums teilte Martin Bottesch mit, dass die soziale Komponente der Arbeit des Forums für viele Mitglieder auf dem Lande wichtiger sei als die politische. Das Siebenbürgenforum wird den Sachsentag 2014 in Mühlbach unter das Motto „Wir sind hier“ stellen und im August 2017 zusammen mit dem HOG-Verband, in Bad Kissingen durch den Vorsitzenden Hans Gärtner vertreten, ein Sachsentreffen in Siebenbürgen veranstalten. Hilfskomitee (Hermann Schuller), Gemeinschaft der evangelischen Pfarrer (Hans-Gerhard Gross), landsmannschaftlicher Verband (Alfred Mrass) und Freundeskreis (Raimar Kremer) betonten die

Notwendigkeit einer intensiveren Zusammenarbeit und den Wunsch nach einem besseren gegenseitigen Verständnis.

Nach den Kurzberichten wurden mehrere konkrete Maßnahmen der einzelnen Organisationen, deren Stand und mögliche Probleme bei der Durchführung besprochen. Die Evangelische Kirche A.B. in Rumänien (EKR) möchte ab 2015 ein Projekt zur Sanierung von voraussichtlich weiteren 13 Kirchenburgen auf den Weg bringen. Diese werden jetzt festgelegt. Dabei sollen wieder EU-Mittel abgerufen werden.

Das Projekt „Glauben und Gedenken“, bei dem der Evakuierung der Nordsiebenbürger im Herbst 1944 und der Deportation der Siebenbürger Sachsen in die Sowjetunion im Januar 1945 gedacht wird, ist organisatorisch abgeschlossen und die Finanzierung gesichert. In mehreren Städten aus Siebenbürgen, Ungarn, Österreich und Deutschland sollen ab August 2014 dazu Veranstaltungen (Gottesdienste, Ausstellungen, Begegnungen) stattfinden.

Bischof Guib berichtete auch darüber, dass die EKR nun den rechtlichen Rahmen für die Mitgliedschaft von ausländischen Bürgern in der EKR, die sogenannte Zweitmitgliedschaft, geschaffen hat (ein gesonderten Bericht folgt in der SbZ Online). Durch die Übersendung eines Erlasses und von Durchführungsbestimmungen an die Bezirkskonsistorien und Pfarrämter werden diese über die möglichen Vorgehensweisen informiert. Bischof Guib bat die Vertreter der sächsischen Organisationen, dies in der Bundesrepublik bekannt zu machen. Evangelische Christen, die schon Mitglieder einer anderen konfessionsverwandten Kirche sind, können Gemeindeglieder (Vollmitglieder) oder Mitglieder im Sonderstatus der EKR unter der Voraussetzung werden, dass sie die Mitgliedschaft in ihrer bisherigen Kirche behalten. Sie müssen den betreffenden Antrag persönlich in Siebenbürgen bei der bevorzugten Kirchengemeinde abgeben. Der Richtwert des Kirchenbeitrags für die Sondermitgliedschaft beträgt 20 Euro im Jahr.

Des Weiteren wurde das geplante gemeinsame Projekt aller Organisationen, in der Ukraine 2015 ein Denkmal zur Erinnerung an die Deportation 1945 zu errichten, diskutiert. Man war sich einig, der betreffenden Arbeitsgruppe zu empfehlen, dieses Denkmal in Siebenbürgen zu erstellen, da die politische Situation in der Ukraine derzeit keine Aussicht auf Erfolg erlaubt. Dr. Cosoroabă machte den Vorschlag, in einer Kirchenburg Zug um Zug eine

Neubauten verdrängen unsere Kirchen: Grenzfälle und Verstöße gegen den Denkmalschutz

2004 und 2005 hat Peter Jacobi mit Bildern verlassener Gebäude und verrottender Gerätschaften auf die Gefahr siebenbürgisch-sächsischer Kirchenburgen hingewiesen, die dem Verfall preisgegeben sind. Es war ein Aufschrei, der wie ein „Paukenschlag“ in der siebenbürgisch-sächsischen und rumänischen Öffentlichkeit gewirkt habe, stellte Bundeskulturreferent Hans-Werner Schuster bei der Eröffnung der Fotoausstellung „Siebenbürgischer Pilgerweg“ Ende letzten Jahres in Heidenheim fest.



In derselben Ausstellung zeigte Peter Jacobi 2013 entstandene Fotos, die Grenzfälle und Verstöße gegen den Denkmalschutz verdeutlichen. Rumänische Behörden und orthodoxe Kirchen errichten Neubauten in unmittelbarer Nähe siebenbürgisch-sächsischer Denkmäler. Peter Jacobi kritisiert diesen verantwortungslosen Umgang mit unserem Kulturerbe: „Die für die Baugenehmigungen

zuständigen Organe sind mit großer Brutalität vorgegangen.“ Das Gesetz sehe vor, dass Neubauten nur unter Wahrung eines Mindestabstandes gegenüber historischen Denkmälern errichtet werden dürfen. In Schellenberg sei das Rathaus gerade mal zehn Meter von der einstigen Ringmauer der Kirche gebaut worden. „Die gut erhaltene und nicht unwichtige Kirche ist praktisch ganz verdeckt, gerade noch durch einen Spalt sichtbar“, betonte Jacobi. Weitere Grenzfälle des Denkmalschutzes werden in den nächsten Ausgaben dieser Zeitung vorgestellt.

Der Parlamentarier des Demokratischen Forums der Deutschen in Rumänien im Parlament in Bukarest, Ovidiu Gaț, bestätigte in einem Gespräch mit der Siebenbürgischen Zeitung, dass Bausünden, wie sie von Peter Jacobi aufgezeigt wurden, seit Jahren ein generelles Problem in Rumänien seien. Tausende orthodoxe Kirchen würden chaotisch gebaut an zum Teil unmöglichen Standorten. Die Gesetzgebung sei zwar in ausreichendem Rahmen gegeben, aber die Verwaltungen, die Bürgermeister, erteilten die Baugenehmigungen unter fragwürdigen Bedingungen, sagte der Parlamentarier. Dies sei ein allgemeines Phänomen, das nicht speziell gegen die deutsche Minderheit gerichtet sei, unter dem sie aber gleichwohl zu leiden hätte. Der einzige Weg sei, dass Betroffene rechtzeitig gegen die Baugenehmigung klagen.




