Plans for the festival were on the verge of collapsing, however, after both Woodstock, NY, and the nearby town of Wallkill denied permission to hold the event. Dairy farmer Max Yasgur came to the rescue at the last minute, giving the promoters access to his 600 acres of land in Bethel, some 50 miles away from

the town of Woodstock.

Early estimates of attendance increased from around 50,000 to 200,000 people. A total of 186,000 advance tickets were sold. However, by the time the gates opened on Friday, August 15th, more than 400,000 people were clamoring to get in. Those without tickets simply walked through the gaps in the fences. The organizers were eventually forced to make the event free of charge, leaving the promoters nearly bankrupt afterwards. However, their ownership of the film and recording rights more than compensated for the losses after the release of a hit documentary film in 1970.

Despite their relative inexperience, those four young promoters managed to sign a roster of top acts. Creedence Clearwater Revival was the first to sign a contract for the event. Following that signing, every-

one else joined in. Some of the remaining 32 acts included: Jefferson Airplane, Joan Baez, Arlo Guthrie, Carlos Santana, Joe Cocker, The Band, The Who, The Grateful Dead, Sly and the Family Stone, Janis Joplin, and Crosby Stills Nash & Young. Folk singer and guitarist Richie Havens kicked off the event Friday evening after the original opening group Sweetwater was caught in traffic trying to get to the location. Jimi Hendrix was the last to perform, taking the stage at 8:30 Monday morning following many rain delays.

Woodstock was one of the largest music festivals in history and would become the peak musical event to reflect the counterculture of the 1960s. In 2017, according to Wikipedia, the festival site became listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The muscles that keep you walking aren't only in your legs

Ask someone which muscles keep them walking and most will point to their thighs. The real workhorse sits lower down -- and some of the muscles that keep people walking well into old age are ones you would never suspect, starting with the back.

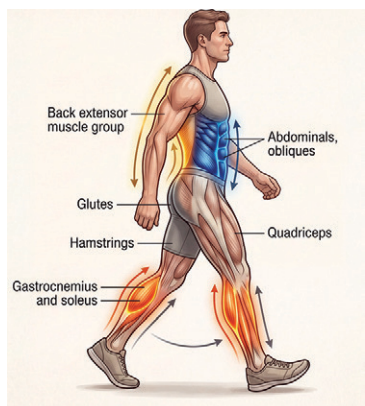
The biggest single contributor to each step is the calf. Those muscles drive the push-off that propels the body forward, and their gradual weakening is the hallmark change in how older people walk. As calf strength fades, steps grow shorter and pace slows, according to the Merck Manual.

When the calves can no longer do the job alone, the body recruits the hip muscles -- the glutes and hip flexors -- to keep the legs swinging through. Older walkers lean on these muscles far more than younger ones do, according to the Merck Manual, which is why keeping the hips strong matters more with age, not less.

Staying upright is itself a muscle job. The back extensors and the core hold the

trunk tall. When they weaken, the upper body drifts forward, the center of gravity shifts, the stride shortens, and a steady walk turns into a shuffle. Back-extensor strength turns out to be one of the most reliable predictors of overall physical function in older adults, according to research in the journal *Heliyon* -- a better marker, in many tests, than the strength of the muscles across the front of the trunk.

Building that strength is only part of the answer. Studies have found that stronger calves alone do not automatically produce a springier step, so physical therapists often pair the strengthening with practice at walking itself, cueing people to push off firmly and stand tall.



We're engaged, civil, and not the ones shouting

If American politics sounds like a shouting match, here is a quiet bit of good news about us. A new study suggests that older Americans are, by and large, not the ones doing the shouting.

Pew Research Center's latest political typology, released in June, sorts Americans into nine groups by their values rather than their party. The single largest group among people 65 and older is one Pew calls the Pragmatic and Polite Right -- a center-right group defined less by hard-line positions than by its taste for civility. According to Pew, only 5 percent of them say they enjoy seeing political opponents humiliated, compared with 53 percent in the most combative group. Among those 65 and older, 21 percent land here -- about three times the share among adults under 50.

The second-largest group among older Americans leans the other way, toward the center-left, which is its own rebuke to the idea that one generation marches in lockstep. Together, the two biggest groups among seniors are the moderate, mixed ones, not the firebrands at either edge.

We are also paying attention. Older Americans are the least likely of any age group to have tuned politics out: just 5 percent fall into Pew's disengaged middle, against 12 percent of adults under 50.

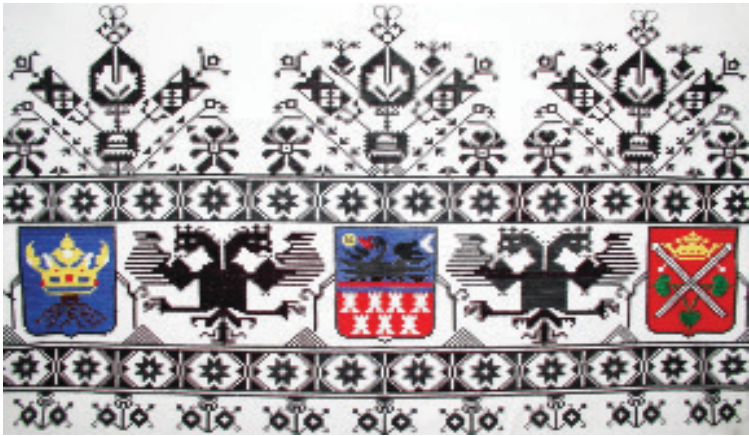

The kids’ debit card, and why parents are signing up

A child with her first debit card quickly learns she can buy almost anything online -- including a music subscription that bills every month, whether she can cover it or not. One careless tap, and a kid is on the hook for a recurring charge she never thought through. Moments like that are why a growing number of parents now hand over a kids’ debit card instead of cash.

Several companies build cards made specifically for children -- Greenlight, GoHenry (now Acorns Early), and BusyKid among them, with even Cash App adding parent-managed kids’ accounts in 2026. Most cost a few dollars a month, and the real value sits in the app behind the card. A parent can send allowance on a schedule, automate chores, set spending limits, limit where the card works, and get a real-time alert on every purchase.

For many parents the draw is not control but visibility. A child using a friend’s setup or a plain payment app may reveal almost nothing; a kid’s card shows the pattern -- where the money goes, how fast, and on what. That lets a parent coach instead of police. And when a surprise subscription does slip through, the lesson tends to stick, especially when the child has to figure out how to cancel it herself.

Pasta e ceci: an ancient Roman comfort dish made simple

Pasta e ceci -- pasta and chickpeas, pronounced roughly ‘pasta eh CHEH-chee’ -- is one of Italy’s oldest comfort foods, and one most Americans have never tasted. It belongs to what Italians call cucina povera, or ‘poor kitchen.’ The thrifty peasant cooking that turns a handful of cheap pantry staples into a filling meal. The dish is genuinely ancient: the Roman poet Horace described eating pasta with chickpeas more than 2,000 years ago in his Satires.

Cheap, filling, and rich in protein, chickpeas made the dish a standby across central and southern Italy, and especially in Rome, where cooks traditionally served it on Fridays as a meatless meal, according to Rome’s tourism office. The earliest versions had no tomato at all, since tomatoes did not reach Italy from the Americas until centuries later.

Ingredients (serves 4)

- 3 tablespoons olive oil.
- 1 small yellow onion, finely chopped
- 2 to 3 anchovy fillets (optional, but traditional in Rome)
- 3 cloves garlic, sliced
- 1 sprig fresh rosemary (or 1 teaspoon dried)



- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 2 cans (15 ounces each) chickpeas, drained and rinsed
- 4 cups vegetable or chicken broth, plus more as needed
- 1 piece Parmesan rind (optional)
- 1 cup ditalini or other small pasta

(broken spaghetti works too)

- Salt and black pepper
- Grated Parmesan or Pecorino.

Directions

1. Warm the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the onion, along with the anchovies if using, and cook until the onion is soft and the anchovies have melted into the oil, about 5 minutes. Stir in the garlic and rosemary and cook one minute.
2. Add the tomato paste and stir it around the pot for a minute or two to deepen its flavor.
3. Add the chickpeas, broth, and Parmesan rind if using. Bring to a gentle simmer. For a creamier pot, scoop out a ladleful of chickpeas and broth, blend or mash it smooth, and stir back.
4. Simmer for about 10 minutes to let the flavors come together.
5. Stir in the pasta and cook until tender, about 10 minutes, stirring now and then so it does not stick. It should be thick and spoonable
6. Remove the rosemary stem and Parmesan. Season with salt and pepper. Serve in bowls topped with grated cheese, and a drizzle of olive oil.
